Executive Summary

The meeting focused on expectations and accountability for MYG Football coaches ahead of the upcoming season. League leadership emphasized the importance of communication, preparedness, and alignment with MYG values. A new requirement for coach interviews was discussed as a way to ensure consistency, safety, and quality across teams. It was made clear that participation in the interview process is mandatory for head coach consideration. The league also reinforced its commitment to creating a positive experience for players, parents, and volunteers.

Coach-Specific Takeaways

- Completion of a **coach interview is required** to serve as a head coach this season.
 - Coaches are expected to:
 - Communicate clearly and promptly with parents and league officials
 - Be organized and prepared for practices and games
 - Model positive behavior and sportsmanship at all times
 - Failure to meet league requirements or expectations may result in reassignment or removal from a head coach role.
 - Coaches are encouraged to ask questions, raise concerns early, and stay engaged with league leadership.
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League-Specific Takeaways

- The league is formalizing processes (such as coach interviews) to improve consistency and accountability.
- Emphasis is being placed on:
 - Player safety
 - Positive culture
 - Clear standards for coaches
- Leadership wants proactive communication to prevent issues during the season rather than reacting after problems arise.
- The goal is long-term program growth while maintaining a strong reputation within the community.
