By 1980, however, the building needed to be rebuilt, as it did not meet regulations. It would take a few years to be fully rebuilt, but by 2000, it was complete. Since then, WGH gained Advanced Life Support (ALS) certification in 2002, which allowed a licensed EMT-Paramedic to lead the ALS team and provide a higher level of emergency care. In 2003, it also earned designation as a critical access hospital. In 2005, WGH built an orthopedic surgery department onto the existing building. Over the following years to now, WGH would expand their partnerships with other hospitals by allowing them to have access to different services that were not previously available. They would also receive many awards for their service and work environment, which proves that they are a good hospital that cares for their patients.

The Wabash General Hospital itself isn't the only thing that makes WGH the center of the community; The staff who work there all contribute to the community as well. Each member of

WGH is kind and ready to help, whether they are in their workspace or not. When they are working, they are very organized and professional, and they tell you everything you need to know, such as what your condition is, how they can help fix it, and they even listen to all of your questions and answer them to their best ability.

Another way that WGH is the center of our community is through town-events and events hosted by Edwards County High School (ECHS). They are always there both to help with the events or watch for any injuries that may occur in them. A great example of this is ECHS football where there are always WGH staff members standing by in case of an emergency on the field. I was unlucky enough to be in an accident during the first game of the season, where I broke my right ankle in three places, but I was taken care of by WGH members. I was taken to the WGH, where I was immediately ready to be taken care of and looked after. Within an hour, I was able to have surgery performed, where they fixed my ankle. Without WGH, I might not have been lucky enough to receive proper treatment.

WGH can be seen as the center of our community due to their loyalty to their patients, excellent award-winning service, and the staff members' contribution to the community outside of the hospital. They are a critical part of everyday living, as they assist people from all kinds of places and continue to improve people's lives.
