
ELECTION DAY IS COMING



We will definitely revisit this event next year during the parade so be thinking of your living window ideas now!





We will most likely revisit the theme: Hometown Heroes for our 2026 parade theme and we hope you join us for Living Windows and Open Houses before and after the parade!




BREAKFAST WITH SANTA

CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL WINNERS AND NOMINEES!




Our 4th annual banquet was a success as we honored over 38 nominees for our seven awards.



NEW EVENT: SHOP SMALL BOUTIQUE CRAWL!




