WHY SO MUCH CONFUSION FOR R323???

R323 – The actual Orange Book Reprint (Reprints from 1919) says as follows:

"* The following explanation is reprinted merely for its historical interest. For the reason that the Greek numerals for six hundred, sixty and six are used in the oldest MMS. It would not be proper to accept any explanation setting forth six plus six plus six. Pastor Russell in later years approved the explanation given in Scripture Studie, Vol. VII"

We find this statement above has been edited in the Expanded Biblical Comments BOOK, for whatever reason the EBC REMOVED the reference pointing to the 7th volume and simply says as follows:

"323:6* "Since Greek numerals for six hundred, sixty and six are used in the oldest manuscripts it would not be proper to set forth six plus six plus six." – As we see the rest of the quote has been omitted in the EBC, and thus seems to be a little misleading in our opinion.
