

## STRATEGIES TO HELP LEARNERS WITH DYSGRAPHIA



Allow the student to have a 'proof-reader' or adapt tests to cut down on the amount of handwriting. (e.g multiple choice)



Give students extra time for writing notes/finishing activities/processing



#### **Materials**

Provide pencil grips or different types of pens to see what works best



Provide information needed to start assignments or projects early





#### **Handouts**

Provide handouts so there is less to copy from the board



#### **Instructions**

Provide step-by-step instructions to present new or difficult information



# **DYSGRAPHIA CHARACTERISTICS**





### Self Image

Low confidence and negative self image as students can be embarrassed by their ability and hand writing



# **Erasing**

Frequent erasing or crossing out



may lead to a sore hand



#### **Avoidance**

Reluctant to complete work and can act disinterested due to the amount of handwriting involved in work



**Spacing** Difficulty spacing things out on paper



Poor spelling including unfinished words or missing words and letters



# General problems experienced by people with Dysgraphia

- Incorrect spelling and capitalisation
- Mix of cursive and print letters
- Inappropriate sizing and spacing of letters
- Difficulty copying words
- Slow or laboured writing
- Difficulty visualising words before writing them
- Unusual body or hand position when writing
- Difficulty concentrating on other things whilst writing
- Watching your hand while you write
- Saying words aloud while writing
- Omitting letters and words from sentences
