Join KJazz Radio host and legendary on-air personality Rhonda Hamilton this November for an unforgettable jazz adventure in Japan. Explore one of the world's most vibrant and deeply rooted jazz cultures, with exclusive experiences, insider access, and unforgettable performances that bring Japan's dynamic jazz scene to life.

Jazz performances are integrated throughout the program and curated by author Michael Pronko, ensuring access to Japan's most celebrated jazz venues and musicians.

Our journey combines Japan's jazz, culture, cuisine, and its legendary drinking traditions - sake, whisky, and shochu. Anchored by Tokyo and Kyoto with time in Kurashiki, a historic canal town, our gateway to central Japan.

Travel by Shinkansen bullet train, with a pace that allows time to explore, listen, and truly absorb Japan's remarkable devotion to jazz.

Tokyo / 4 nights

The Heartbeat of Japanese Jazz

By day, we explore Tokyo's iconic highlights, the ancient Senso-ji Temple in Asakusa, its serene gardens, and world-class museums.

We dive into Japan's culinary traditions, from ramen and yakitori to tempura, izakaya dining, and exceptional sushi.

Evenings focus on Jazz, with performances at legendary clubs including venues like Body & Soul and Some Time, as well as intimate kissa, small jazz cafes that reveal the depth of Japan's devotion to the music.

We'll also visit the scene in Yokohama, which emerged as one of Japan's earliest jazz centers in the years following World War II.

Kurashiki / 3 nights

Surprising Kurashiki and the legacy of Hiroshima

Kurashiki is a beautifully preserved town with roots in the Edo period. We walk the canal district to get our bearings, exploring its white-walled storehouses and merchant past. The next morning, we travel to Hiroshima for a day exploring the Peace Memorial Park and the city's remarkable rebirth from World War II.

Our final day is yours to enjoy - browse galleries and cafés, explore artist workshops, the Ohara Museum of Art or venture to nearby Naoshima Art Island. En route to Kyoto, we visit the Himeji Castle, a feudal masterpiece.



Kyoto / 3 nights

Serene Zen mornings and electric Osaka jazz nights

Kyoto reveals both its iconic face and quieter corners - from the shimmering Golden Pavilion (Kinkaku-ji) to Sanzen-in temple tucked into rural hills north of the city.

We'll walk the historic Gion district, and along Ninenzaka's preserved streets, scenes lifted straight from classic Kyoto imagery.

Evenings continue our musical journey, curated through Michael Pronko's deep connections to Japan's jazz world, including an excursion to Osaka, where the city's energetic nightlife and influential jazz scene have shaped Japan's musical identity for generations.

Our final night celebrates music, food, and drink for a fitting farewell to Japan.


