DAY 0: Depart the US for Amsterdam

Be sure to depart the US no later than April 27.

Day 1: Tuesday, April 28 - Amsterdam - Hidden Canal Gardens

Arrive in historic Amsterdam and check in to your four-star city-center hotel. Late afternoon, step behind the façades of 17th-century canal house gardens. In the early evening, meet your garden host Dan Hinkley and guide, Ian Cooke, and gather with fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. Sleep in Amsterdam at the Park Centraal Amsterdam**** (D)



DAY 2: Wednesday, April 29 - The Dutch Golden Age:

Your day with a private tour of the renowned Rijksmuseum, home to masterpieces by Rembrandt, Vermeer, and Frans Hals. Admire the iconic *Night Watch* and landscapes showcasing Dutch life. The museum's grand halls and quiet corners make for a memorable visit. In the afternoon, visit Johannapark's 40-year-old community garden in the heart of Amsterdam. This garden was saved thanks to Arend Jan van der Horst and his forward-thinking vision. If time allows, we will visit another canal mansion and garden. *Sleep in Amsterdam at the Park Centraal Amsterdam* **** (B, L)





Enjoy a private tour of the renowned Rijksmuseum

DAY 3: Thursday, April 30 – Vibrant Tulip Fields, Grand Estates & Embarkation Step outside Amsterdam for a morning among the vibrant tulip fields and flower farms of Keukenhof. Wander through colorful patchwork fields and visit family-run farms to see tulips, hyacinths, and daffodils cultivated with care. Stroll the landscaped gardens of Keukenhof, where fragrant flowerbeds and elegant water features create a living canvas.

Then, we are off to the Beeckestijn Estate in Velsen-Zuid. This peaceful escape offers a mix of romantic parklands and sleek, geometric gardens. Explore the gardens around the country house, then wander through natural, winding paths with water features and open fields. Key highlights include the flower fan, serpentine walls, Baroque ornamental garden, and chapel. This is perfect spot to unwind amidst nature and history. Sleep on board (B, D)

DAY 4: Friday, May 1 – Vianen to Schoonhoven to Kinderdijk to Dordrecht Today we'll travel along a beautiful route to Schoonhoven – nicknamed Zilverstad ("Silver City") – a city renowned for its talented silver smiths since the 17th century. Later in the day as you explore the Alblasserwaard region you will reach Kinderdijk, a village famous for its impressive row of 19 large windmills. All 19 windmills have a UNESCO cultural heritage listing and are a definite highlight – don't forget to bring your camera! Sleep on board (B, L, D)

Day 5: Saturday, May 2 - Dordrecht to Willemstad to Bergen op Zoom

As you enjoy your breakfast aboard the ship, the ship will sail to Willemstad, a beautiful old fortified town on the Haringvliet waterway before continuing on to Tholen. Once an island in the middle of the large Zeeland streams, where many people fished for their living, Tholen is now connected to the mainland in various ways.

Then you continue to today's final destination, Bergen op Zoom. Bergen op Zoom is a historic fortified town that once lay on the open waters of the Oosterschelde. After dinner you can take a walk through the old town. The narrow streets, old town, market and church squares and idiosyncratic monumental buildings show the history of a rich and eventful past that goes back more than eight hundred years. Sleep on board (B, L, D)





Your comfy charming home away from home

DAY 6: Sunday, May 3 - Bergen op Zoom to Antwerp

Sail to Antwerp today, a vibrant port city on the Schelde River. Known as the world's diamond capital, Antwerp was also home to great artists including Peter Paul Rubens, Anthony van Dyck, and Jacob Jordaens.

You may choose to visit the Red Star Line Museum, which movingly tells the story of the three million emigrants who departed from Antwerp for America between 1873 and 1935. Secret garden tours are also planned, and no visit would be complete without sampling Belgium's mussels, beer, and chocolate! (*B*, *L*, *D*)

DAY 7: Monday, May 4 - Antwerp to St. Amands

This morning you will venture out of Antwerp along a picturesque section of the Schelde River to St. Amands, your home for the night. There is only one way to describe the landscape around the Schelde and that is magnificent. It is without doubt one of the natural highlights of the tour. Sleep on board (B, L, D)

DAY 8: Tuesday, May 5 - St. Amands to Dendermonde to Ghent

Today we cruise along the Schelde River to Ghent, a vibrant university city steeped in history. Once a thriving trading port since Roman times, Ghent is home to 18 museums, over 100 churches, and 400+ historic buildings. Key sights include the stunning St. Bavo Cathedral with the famous *Adoration of the Mystic Lamb* by Jan van Eyck, and the 91-meter Belfry Tower. Explore before dinner and soak in the charm of this medieval gem! (B, L)





Discover historic Bruges!

DAY 9: Wednesday, May 6 - Ghent to Bruges

Today you will travel from Ghent through the beautiful Flemish countryside of western Flanders to Bruges, widely described as the 'Venice of the North' and arguably the most beautiful of all the Flemish cities. Bruges has managed to maintain its historic fabric as it has evolved over the centuries and today the city's original Gothic buildings form an integral part of the town's identity. While in Bruges we will be joining local experts and exploring the architecture, history and secret gardens of the city. In the evening, let's meet up with our host, guide and fellow travelers for a special farewell feast. Sleep on board (B, L, D)

DAY 10: Thursday, May 7 - Homeward Bound

After breakfast, disembark and transfer to either Amsterdam or Brussels for flights home or enjoy some more time in Europe. Cities such as Paris and London are just a few hours away by high-speed train. Return home with a lifetime of happy memories! (*B*)


