

The Adventure Begins...

Air Travel Days: February 5 & 6 - Depart the US

Remember, you'll lose one day crossing the International Date Line, but not to worry, you'll get it back upon your return to the USA.

Day 1: Monday, February 7 - Arrive in Auckland

Upon arrival in New Zealand you will be met by your Earthbound Expeditions guide and transferred to your centrally-located hotel. To start off the day we'll enjoy a morning cruise on the beautiful Aitemata Harbor. Then enjoy a welcome lunch with your guide and fellow travelers. After lunch we'll officially check in to our hotel. This evening is free to rest and relax, or explore Auckland. Sleep in Auckland (B, L - Breakfast will be served on board before landing.)



Day 2: Tuesday, February 8 – Exploring Auckland:

Enjoy an extensive city tour of Auckland which includes the quaint village of Devonport and takes in the views from atop Mt Eden, an extinct volcano. We'll also visit the Auckland Domain Winter gardens, where hot houses show off lush tropical plants and Eden Garden, featuring one of the largest collections of camellias in the Southern Hemisphere. The rest of the afternoon is free to enjoy the City of Sails at leisure. Sleep in Auckland (B, L)

Day 3: Wednesday, February 9 - South to Rotorua


Depart Auckland and drive through magnificent countryside to Longlands Dairy Farm for a tour followed by a delicious home-cooked lunch. Then we set off for Rotorua for a visit to Paradise Valley Springs. Here you can walk through the tree top canopy of native Tawa Trees, hundreds of years old. Sleep in Rotorua (B, L, D)

Day 4: Thursday, February 10 - Thermal pools and a Maori Performance in Rotorua

Today explore the Living Maori Village of Whakarewarewa. Your local guide, a descendent of generations of guides from the region, will educate and delight you with stories of the Village and valley. See how locals use the natural geothermal energy for everyday use, and experience traditional dances and songs from a resident haka group - Te Pakira. This evening you will experience an entertaining Maori feast. Sleep in Rotorua (B, D)

Day 5: Friday, February 11 - To Napier via Huka Falls and Garden Visits in Taupo

Today we travel along the Thermal Explorer Highway to view the mighty Huka Falls before continuing to Lake Taupo with a garden visit (or two!) along the way. We'll also visit the Taupo Museum, with its re-creation of '100% Pure New Zealand Ora - Garden of Wellbeing', New Zealand's gold medal-winning entry in the 2004 Chelsea Flower Show, which showcases central North Island flora. After an independent lunch, we will continue on to Napier, "The Art Deco Capital of the World", which was destroyed by an earthquake in 1931. We'll enjoy a historical walking tour before checking in to our waterfront hotel. Tonight, we'll dine together at a local eatery. Sleep in Napier (B, D)





Enjoy the Trans-Alpine Train Experience

Day 6: Saturday, February 12 - Napier to Wellington via a Winery Visit

After breakfast, we'll head South towards Wellington. En-route we'll visit a winery in order to sample some of New Zealand's finest wines. With 84% of the country's sauvignon blanc plantings, Marlborough is New Zealand's (some say the world's) sauvignon blanc capital. With robust aromas and crisp flavors of gooseberry and capsicum, this varietal has been a glittering success for New Zealand. The region's second VIP grape is pinot noir. Acclaim is mounting for Marlborough's fragrant, mouth-filling reds which are richly flavored and supple. Other Marlborough wine specialties include fresh, vibrantly fruity chardonnays and crisp Rieslings.

Enjoy a tasting and a light lunch before continuing south and arriving in Wellington in the late afternoon. This evening is free to explore Wellington. Sleep in Wellington (B, D)

Day 7: Sunday, February 13 - Wellington's Cultural Center

Today our extensive city tour will highlight Wellington's tremendous history and culture. Then we'll soak up a little history, art and culture at the Te Papa Museum. There is something for everyone here and you won't want to miss this museum which helps unravel the many mysteries of this land.

Your afternoon is free, but if you're looking for an excursion, we can highly recommend the cable car ride to the Wellington Botanic Garden! Here you can see the protected native forest, specialized plant collections, colorful floral displays and views over the city. Also, the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa - the national museum and art gallery - is exceptional and well worth a visit. Sleep in Wellington (B)

Day 8: Monday, February 14 - Ferry and and Coach South to Christchurch

After breakfast we depart by ferry for the South Island. Crossing the "big ditch" takes just a few hours. Upon arrival, we'll board a scenic coastal train and make our way to Christchurch. Relax and sit pack as the coastal scenery opens up. We'll have dinner upon arrival in Christchurch. Sleep in Christchurch (B, D)

Day 9: Tuesday, February 15 - Exploring Christchurch


Called the Garden City, Christchurch is also one of five cities in the world known as a 'gateway to Antarctica.' The city acts as a conduit to the icy continent, sharing and championing Antarctic geography, history and culture. Today we'll visit the best gardens of the city and the Antarctic Center. Sleep in Christchurch (B, L)

Day 10: Wednesday, February 16 - TranzAlpine Train from Christchurch to Arthur's Pass

In a country known for spectacular scenery, today is tops! This morning we'll board the TranzAlpine train for a stunning alpine adventure from Christchurch to Arthur's Pass. Known as one of the most famous and beautiful train rides in the world, we'll traverse the fertile farmlands of the Canterbury Plains and have thrilling vistas over deep gorges. Our plan is to disembark at Arthur's Pass (having seen the most beautiful scenery) and board our private motor coach to Greymouth for lunch. From Greymouth we'll continue by motor coach to Franz Josef town. Sleep in Franz Josef town (B, L, D)

Day 11: Thursday, February 17 - Franz Josef town to Queenstown

This morning we continue south from Franz Josef town to Queenstown. It's a beautiful drive and we'll stop for lunch along the way. The late afternoon and evening are yours to enjoy Queenstown independently. Sleep in Queenstown (B, L)

Day 12: Friday, February 18 - Queenstown and Milford Sound: Don't forget your camera today! Today is a full day excursion to Milford Sound. Bounded by steep cliffs and dense rainforest, Milford Sound is by far the best known of all of the fjords in New Zealand, and the only one that can be accessed by road. Rain or shine, Milford Sound continues to captivate even the most experienced traveler. At the pinnacle of Milford Sound is the iconic Mitre Peak standing a proud 5,000 feet above sea level, it is certainly an impressive sight to behold. We'll comfortably travel the length of the fjord to open ocean and return today. Sleep in Queenstown (B, L)

Day 13: Saturday, February 19 - Free Day in Queenstown and Stratosfare Restaurant

Queenstown is New Zealand's adventure capital! Today is yours to get out and explore your surroundings. Options include: jet boating, canyoning, white water rafting, paragliding, fishing, biking, and bungee jumping! This evening, enjoy a gondola ride and farewell dinner at the Stratosfare Restaurant. Sleep in Queenstown (B, D)

Day 14: Sunday, February 20 - Return home with a lifetime of memories, or travel on to Sydney, Australia!

Having experienced some of the finest scenery and gardens in New Zealand, it's time to say goodbye. You will be transferred to the Queenstown airport for your flight home after a memorable holiday.
