### YOUR WSHU ADVENTURE BEGINS!

#### Day 1: Saturday, February 8 - Arrive in Historic Havana

After clearing Cuban immigrations and customs, you will be welcomed by your Cuban National guide outside the terminal, who will assist with a private transfer to your hotel. Enjoy a stroll on the waterfront or relax by the pool with a mojito before meeting your guide and host for a welcome dinner at one of Havana's best known, privately-owned paladars. Sleep in Havana (D)

Day 2: Sunday, February 9 - Havana Old Town and School of Ballet The story of Spain and Cuba began with Christopher Columbus setting foot on the island in October 1492. It wasn't until 1511, when Diego Velázquez de Cuéllar founded a lasting Spanish settlement in Baracoa, that a new chapter of history unfolded. During this era, native populations suffered greatly, with many enslaved by the Spanish after surviving initial waves of disease and conquest.

Fast forward to today, strolling through Havana's old town feels like stepping through a living history book. Every cobblestone whispers tales of conquest and colonization, where the clash and fusion of African, European, and Central/South American cultures birthed a vibrant new identity.





Then, we are off to the celebrated school of ballet where you'll discover how ballet found its groove in Cuba and witness the Cuban's remarkable talent in this art form.

Afterward, we'll make our way to the iconic Hotel Nacional de Cuba, a historic gem that's seen it all over its 92-year history. From pivotal moments in Cuban history to hosting stars like Gary Cooper, Johnny Weissmuller, Buster Keaton, Errol Flynn, and even the Dukes of Windsor, this hotel is brimming with stories. Let's cap off our visit with a trip to the rooftop for an unparalleled bird's-eye view of Havana!

Later, return to the hotel to recharge before we head out for an evening of culinary delights at a private residence.

Your day in Havana promises to be both enriching and unforgettable! Sleep in Havana (B, L, D)

#### Day 3: Monday, February 10 - A Day with Hemingway & Classic Cars

After breakfast, we'll depart for a full-day excursion. Our morning stop is to visit the social-cultural project, Proyectorgo This project emerged 7 years ago, due to the artistic concerns of the community of San Francisco de Paula, San Miguel del Padrón. Its founder, Joan Barrios, will receive us with a welcome cocktail and a delicious Cuban coffee. We'll learn how this project has positively impacted people of various age groups and see some artists in action while enjoying good traditional Cuban music! You will taste some delicious homemade sweets, made by a local entrepreneurship project. Further you observe how the workshops of Plastic Arts, Dance, Music and Literature, Horticulture and Martial Arts such as Karate are taught.

We'll continue on for a late morning visit to Ernest Hemingway's estate, Finca Vigia (Lookout Farm). Hemingway lived in this house for 20 years, where he wrote some of the most relevant books of his Nobel Prize winning career. His typing machine, hunting trophies and beloved *Pilar* yacht are included among the belongings at the museum. (The Hemingway House can only be visited from the outside with a view through the large panoramic windows and doors to the inside of all rooms).

We'll have lunch together in the village of Cojimar - the inspirational backdrop to Hemingway's The Old Man and the Sea.

In the afternoon, we'll visit to Nostalgicar. Vintage cars are a big part of the urban scenery in Cuba, particularly in Havana and Nostalgicar will give us a glimpse into this fascinating world of car restoration.

Later, return to your hotel to recharge before we head out for an evening of culinary delights at a private residence. Sleep in Havana (B, L, D)





Experience the rhythms of Cuba!

Day 4: Tuesday, February 11 - Las Terrazas UNESCO biosphere and the Orquesta Vocal Clave de Sol Experience the tranquility of Las Terrazas, an ecological haven nestled just 95 miles west of Havana. This sustainable tourist community offers a unique connection with nature. Designated as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve in 1985, Las Terrazas arose from efforts in the late 1960s to restore an area once ravaged by intensive coffee cultivation.

Spanning 5,000 hectares, Las Terrazas features millions of trees planted, terraces carved for cultivation, and a small village built with strict environmental guidelines. Today, it stands as a natural paradise where land is nurtured rather than exploited, fostering harmony with nature's cycles. Las Terrazas is also a thriving ecovillage attracting a vibrant community of artists. Their workshops and studios are open for exploration, yet the true allure lies in the lush natural surroundings.

We'll return to Havana in the late afternoon, stopping to visit the Orquesta Vocal Clave de Sol. The school has achieved remarkable growth by nurturing a vibrant children's guitar orchestra. Founded in 2009 by art teachers Nuria Garcia Reyes and Yamile Garcia Zurita in Havana's San Agustin neighborhood, the orchestra has grown to include 250 children and teenagers from various parts of the city.

Independent dinner this evening - there are restaurants and cafés at the hotel. Casa Mia Paladar on the sea is within walking distance of the hotel. And, if you are looking for a private house (paladar) with character, we can recommend, Atelier, about a 5-minute cab ride away. Reservations needed. Sleep in Havana (B, L)



#### Day 5: Wednesday, February 12 - Havana Dance Queens and Rumba

This morning we depart for Casa Miglis for a salsa lesson with one or more of the dancers of Havana Queens, directed by Rosario García Rodríguez (graduated from Escuela Nacional Del Arte and Universidad de las Artes) and stage director Balbina Aspron Chávez (Cuban TV Ballet).

Enjoy lunch in a private residence.

In the afternoon we set out to learn and discover the world of Rumba and Santeria. In Havana, the currents of Cuban Santeria weave through the urban landscape like a vibrant tapestry waiting to unfold. The colorful beaded bracelets and necklaces worn by locals are more than mere accessories - they symbolize a deep mysticism. These patterns of color represent a spiritual dedication to the Orishas, the gods and goddesses of West African origin in Santeria.

Often described as a "Latin-African country" by Fidel Castro, Cuba's unique cultural blend of African, Latino, and native Taino influences gave birth to Santeria's supernatural worldview. The homes of Havana, adorned with an array of saints and sacred relics, reflect a syncretic belief system that merges Catholicism with the Yoruba religious traditions of West Africa.

Return to your hotel and relax and freshen up before heading out to dinner with your host and guide. Sleep in Havana (B, L, D)

#### Day 6: Thursday, February 13 - Museum of Fine Arts and Studio Tour

This morning enjoy a guided tour of the Museum of Fine Arts. The Cuban Arts building features galleries covering art from the 17th century to the present, showcasing themes such as religion, landscapes, and everyday life scenes known as "costumbrismo". Artists highlighted in this building include Rene Portocarrero, Rita Lonja, Wilfredo Lam, and many others. The Universal Art building itself is a masterpiece of architecture, boasting a grand staircase, a large mural, and an eclectic Spanish Renaissance-style design from 1927.

Enjoy another delicious lunch together.

This afternoons highlights include private receptions and intimate exchanges with renowned Cuban artists at their own studios and personal residences. As a participant, you'll enjoy a unique opportunity to purchase Cuban art directly from the artists themselves! It's a special chance to engage with the local art community and acquire authentic pieces straight from the creators.

Return to the hotel and relax and refresh before heading out for a farewell dinner with your host and guide. Sleep in Havana (B, L, D)





#### Day 7: Friday, February 14 - Muraleando and an afternoon classical concert

After breakfast, together we will head to Muraleando, a cultural community center that has transformed a neighborhood into an art gallery. Created to build artistic skills in children, classes are offered in pottery, painting, music, dance and engraving. This visit will serve as an exceptionally inspiring high note on which to end the tour.

Enjoy a classical concert in the afternoon. Then, return to your hotel. Rest and relax before joining your host and guide for a farewell dinner all together at a local paladar! Sleep in Havana (B, L, D)

#### Day 8: Saturday, February 15 - Depart Cuba for the US

Transfer to Havana's Jose Marti Airport and check in for your return flight to the States. Buen Viaje! (B)

#### **MEET YOUR WSHU HOST!**

Suzanne Bona is the host and executive producer of *Sunday Baroque*, a syndicated weekly radio show of Baroque and early music. She originated the program in 1987 on WSHU Public Radio in her hometown of Fairfield, CT. *Sunday Baroque* has been distributed nationally since 1998, and is currently heard by more than a quarter million listeners every week on more than 200 public radio stations and networks across the United States.

Suzanne is also a classically trained flutist who earned a Bachelor of Music degree from The University of Connecticut. She continues to perform frequently as a soloist and chamber musician, and has especially enjoyed collaborating with some of her musically talented public radio colleagues in performances for listeners across the country, including in West Lafayette, IN, Phoenix, AZ, Cincinnati, OH, across Connecticut and on Long Island, NY, and in March 2012 as guest soloist with the Guam Symphony Orchestra in Tumon, and again in October 2016 with some chamber musicians in Guam.

When she is not making radio or playing her flute, Suzanne's hobbies include reading, running, cooking, baking and travel! She is also passionate about the cause of literacy; she was a longtime volunteer tutor and board member for her local Literacy Council, and she is currently a community advisory board member for a children's literacy initiative.



## Know Before You Go

This legal Cuba tour is operated under the OFAC (The Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Asset Control) general license, section 31 CFR § 515.572(a)(1) which allows us to provide travel services to U.S. travelers to Cuba, in the category of "Support for the Cuban People." It requires that each traveler utilizing this authorization engage in a full-time schedule of activities that enhance contact with the Cuban people, support civil society in Cuba, or promote the Cuban people's independence from Cuban authorities and that result in meaningful interactions with individuals in Cuba. The traveler's schedule of activities must not include free time or recreation in excess of that consistent with a full-time schedule in Cuba. For a complete description of what this general license authorizes and the restrictions that apply, see 31 CFR § 515.574.

Cuba is a developing country and still lacks many modern conveniences. It's not unusual to experience short power blackouts or to find that your hot water, internet, TV or phone in your hotel room does not work properly (or at all). Further, the Cuban government and incoming Havana agency has the right to change the itinerary without notice (and often does). We'll be travelling under a "Support of the Cuban People" license, which means that our days will be filled with independent activities intended to strengthen civil society in Cuba. Your day will begin around 8:30am and end around 5:00pm. This is not a trip for those looking for a leisurely, five-star beach holiday or a deluxe resort experience. Travelers who arrive in Havana with a sense of humor, an open mind, and are ready to be flexible, will absolutely fall in love with the people and culture of Cuba.

Reservations and Deposits: A \$500 per person deposit is needed to confirm your space on this journey. You can make a credit card deposit online or by phone. Once the deposit is processed, a deposit packet is emailed with pertinent journey details. Deposits are refundable, minus a \$150 per person cancellation fee, for 60 days from the processing date or 90 days prior to departure, whichever comes first. Deposits made 90 days prior to a trip departing are not refundable. Final payment is also non-refundable which is why we strongly urge guests to purchase travel insurance.

Not Included: Cuban Tourist Card (aka visa) fee of \$100 \* Travel Insurance (in addition to included \$1,000 mandatory medical coverage which is offered through Delta and American Airlines when purchasing your ticket) \*International Airline tickets and luggage fees \*Specialty beverages with meals (other than those mentioned in itinerary) \*Meals not mentioned\*Laundry/room/mini-bar service \* Gratuities for housekeeping staff \*Items of a personal nature and anything not listed in the "It's Included" section on page two.
