

DAY 0: September 6 - Depart the U.S. for Amsterdam! Remember, you'll need to depart the U.S. no later than today.

#### DAY 1: September 7 - Arrive in Amsterdam

Arrive in Amsterdam and transfer to your centrally located four-star hotel. Enjoy a stroll through the old town or along the historic canals before meeting your Earthbound Expeditions guide and your Garden Time hosts for an orientation and welcome dinner. Sleep in the heart of Amsterdam (B, D)

#### DAY 2: September 8 - The Dutch Golden Age

After breakfast, discover the hidden and historic sights of this fascinating city. Enjoy a private tour of the Rijksmuseum and see Rembrandt's famous Night Watch. History and art lovers may wish to visit the Van Gogh museum, Anne Frank house or the Hortus Botanicus independently. There will free time this afternoon to pursue your interests. Sleep in the heart of Amsterdam (B, D)

### DAY 3: September 9 - Flower Auction and Floriworld

The Aalsmeer Flower Auction is the largest in the world. An amazing twenty million flowers from all over the world are sold daily here. This morning you'll tour the facilities and see where the auction takes place. After, we'll have an interactive experience with flowers and plants at Floriworld. Return to Amsterdam in the late afternoon. Sleep in the heart of Amsterdam (B, D)

#### DAY 4: September 10 - Antwerp, Belgium and on to historic Ghent

Antwerp is a port city on Belgium's River Scheldt, with history dating to the Middle Ages. In its center, the centuries-old Diamond District houses thousands of diamond traders, cutters and polishers. Antwerp's Flemish Renaissance architecture is typified by the Grote Markt, a central square in the old town. At the 17th-century Rubens House, period rooms display works by the Flemish Baroque painter Peter Paul Rubens. Sleep in charming Ghent (B)

#### DAY 5: September 11-A day in Ghent!

The city of Ghent lies between Brussels and city of Bruges. It is often overlooked by travelers who choose to visit its more famous neighbors and thus, it has a more authentic feel. It is a prominent cultural hub and a major university town with thousands of students giving it a very lively and cheerful vibe.

After enjoying a traditional Belgian lunch together, we set out to explore the University Botanical Garden. More than 10,000 different plant species in the tropical and subtropical greenhouses of the University Botanical Garden are in bloom and appealing to all. Discover special plants, learn more about plants and their relationship with humans or simply enjoy a leisurely stroll in a beautiful setting. Sleep in charming Ghent (B, L)

#### DAY 6: September 12-An outing to Stunning Bruges

Charming Bruges is the perfect, pocket-sized medieval city. Laced with canals, it was at one time, a great North European trading port. The magnificently detailed paintings of its artists, such as Jan van Eyck and Hans Memling, record its wealth in clothing, jewelry and ornament. Then it fell rapidly into decline and slept until rediscovered and restored to glory in the 19th century. Today, the city of Bruges is a vibrant cultural hub.

Enjoy a guided visit of this perfectly preserved medieval gem, a bucket of mussels and a good Belgian beer (and chocolate) before making our way back to Ghent in the afternoon. Sleep in charming Ghent (B, L)


#### Day 7: September 13 - Kinderdijk and Gouda

In the beautiful wetlands around Dordrecht, you will find the windmills of Kinderdijk. Nineteen beautiful windmills, built around 1740, stand here as part of a larger water management system to prevent floods. Today, they symbolize Dutch water management, and in 1997 they were declared to

be UNESCO World Heritage.

After touring the windmills, we visit the town of Gouda! The birthplace of the Netherlands' most delicious food exports -Gouda cheese and stroopwafels - Gouda is a tasty discovery. But there's more than the legendary Gouda cheese market to put on your city itinerary. Sleep in The Hague (B, L)





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Day 8: September 14 - Botanical Gardens of **Leiden & the Hague:** Today we set off to explore the charming city of Leiden. Enjoy a guided tour of the city center. It's known for its centuries-old architecture and for Leiden University. The university also houses the Hortus botanicus of Leiden, founded in 1590, where the tulip was introduced to Western Europe. One of the Europe's first botanic gardens, now part of the University of Leiden. It is small and beautifully kept. There is also a Japanese garden named after

the scientist Von Siebolt who carried out botanical research in Japan during the 19th century. Part of the botanical garden is a historical reconstruction of the very first version of Leiden university botanical garden. There is also a systematic garden named after the Swedish botanist Carl Linnaeus.

In the afternoon we return to the Hague in order to enjoy an exclusive tour of the Mauritshuis Museum, where you will view the best of Dutch painting from the Golden Age. The compact, yet world-renowned collection is situated in the heart of The Hague, right next to the government center. Masterpieces such as Vermeer's Girl with a Pearl Earring; The Anatomy Lesson of Dr. Nicolaes Tulp by Rembrandt; The Goldfinch by Fabritius and The Bull by Potter are on permanent display in the intimate rooms of this 17<sup>th</sup> century monument. We then set out to discover the Japanese garden created in the early 1900's by its then-owner Baroness van Brienen on our next stop. She traveled several times to Japan and the Orient and brought back authentic items such as sculptures, water bridges, lanterns,

a pavilion, plants and cherry blossom trees. Sleep in The Hague (B, L)



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Day 9: September 15 - Visit the Floriade Garden Expo!

Holland's once-in-a-decade World's Fair of Horticulture will be held in 2022! And we have managed to reserve tickets, just for you! Set across a vast, 150-acre site, more than 300 eco-homes have been built as part of the show, with plans for the area to be turned into a green residential neighborhood of 660 homes once it's finished. The theme in 2022? Building, creating and designing the green city of the future.

This evening we return to The Hague and toast to our marvelous adventure! Sleep in The Hague (B, L)

### DAY 10: September 16 - Homeward Bound

After breakfast, transfer to Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport for your flights home or enjoy some more time in Europe. Cities such as Paris and London are just a few hours away by high-speed train. Return home with a lifetime of happy memories!



## Meet Your Hosts!



**Judy Alleruzzo** (Pictured with Ryan Seely) is the Co-Host of the Garden Time TV show which is in its 16th season! She also works for Al's Garden & Home as the perennial plant buyer and the houseplant buyer.

Over 20 years ago, Judy arrived in Oregon to visit friends in Canby on a glorious April day. She remembers it as a spectacular sunny day and "Everything was in bloom." Having lived in Chicago all her life, she was awed by the colorful landscape in the month of April. Of course, the Oregon weather

turned back to its true self of cool and rainy weather, but she was smitten. She returned to Chicago, packed up and returned by September.

Needing a job, she walked into Al's, then called, Al's Fruit & Shrub, and was lucky there was a job opening for a cashier. Working for what was a small company at the time, Judy was excited to learn many different jobs including stocking, planning and buying in perennials for the retail stores. Judy has an Ornamental Horticulture degree but never worked at a garden center before beginning her job at Al's. It has been a busy and rewarding job, as Al's has grown to 4 retail stores and doubled their growing facility.

Over 10 years ago, she said yes to becoming the houseplant buyer. It was a challenging job to learn and remember a whole other palette of plants. Many years ago, Judy worked for a plant rental

#### **KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!**


All guests will be required to present proof of full vaccination against the Covid-19 virus at least two weeks (four weeks for the Johnson and Johnson vaccine) before departure in order to travel on an Earthbound Expedition.

#### Physical and Medical Requirements:

In addition, in order to make the most of your custom journey and join all included activities, you should be able to walk at a moderate pace, independently, for one to three miles, often over uneven cobblestones. You should also feel comfortable standing for an extended period of time during walking or museum tours or visits to other sights. Naturally, you may always choose to bow out of an activity and enjoy the sites while sipping a tea or coffee in a café. You can also hire a taxi, pedicab or horse-drawn carriage at your own expense to get you to the next attraction. Remember, you'll also need to be able to maneuver your luggage through the airport. Some museums may not have an elevator, so you'll need to climb a few stairs in order to participate.

**Dress:** In general, we suggest "casually smart" dress and a good pair of walking shoes. You may leave your formal attire and please, leave your treasured family jewels at home. You may also wish to check the average monthly temperatures for your destination before you go.
