DAY 0: Depart the USA for Bella Italia

Today, say arrivederci to the USA and begin your journey to Italy's stunning Lake District no later than September 13, 2026. If time allows, consider arriving a day or two early-Lake Maggiore is unforgettable, and you may never want to leave!

DAY 1: September 14 - Buongiorno! Welcome to Lake Maggiore

Welcome to Lake Maggiore — where nature meets UNESCO beauty! This stunning lake and its lush surroundings are a haven of biodiversity, sustainability, and breathtaking landscapes. While in Stresa, we will explore gardens, parks, and protected nature—all part of a living model for conservation. This evening, meet your host Christina Owen and Ray Larson, your Earthbound guide Aurélien Clavero and fellow travelers for a festive welcome orientation and multi-course dinner.

Sleep in the lovely lakeside town of Stresa at the Hotel Palma (D)

Complimentary airport transfers on Day 1: A complimentary group transfer from Milan Malpensa Airport (MXP) to Stresa will be provided at 11:00 AM and 3:00pm.

DAY 2: September 15 - The Garden Islands of Lake Maggiore

Today we set out by private boat to explore the famed gardens of Lake Maggiore, considered among the most exquisite in Europe. Our day begins with a visit to the spectacular Isola Bella, home to the Baroque Palazzo Borromeo and its dramatic Italianate garden. Terraced like a grand ship floating on the water, the garden overflows with citrus trees, rare blooms, fountains, statues, and proud white peacocks that roam the grounds. We'll enjoy a guided tour of both the palace and gardens with time to linger on your own.

Next, we ferry to Isola Madre, the largest of the Borromean Islands, known for its serene English-style botanical garden, where rare subtropical plants thrive in harmony with ancient camphor trees and collections of azaleas, rhododendrons, and magnolias. After a relaxed lunch together, you may wish to explore further or return early to Stresa to relax along the lakefront promenade. Sleep in Stresa at the Hotel Palma (B, L)

DAY 3: September 16 - Villa Pallavicino and Free Time in Stresa

This morning, we visit the beautiful Villa Pallavicino, a tranquil 19th-century estate just outside of town, set in a sweeping park with century-old trees, lush flowerbeds, and a small wildlife sanctuary. With stunning views across Lake Maggiore and a peaceful atmosphere, it's a fitting final garden visit before we depart for Provence.

After our garden stroll, enjoy free time in Stresa—browse elegant shops, sip espresso at a lakeside café, or wander the historic old town. Sleep in Stresa at the Hotel Palma (B, D)





Explore the stunning gardens of the Italian & French Riviera

DAY 4: September 17 - South to the Italian Riviera!

After an early breakfast, we say "arrivederci" to Lake Maggiore and head to the coastal town of Alassio. Here we find one of the most stunning gardens of the Italian Riviera, the Giardini di Villa della Pergola! The colors and scents will light up your senses giving you an experience that you will hardly forget. Situated on the green slopes of the Alassian hills, the villa enjoys an enviable view of the sea and is surrounded by twentytwo thousand square meters of park in perfect harmony with the surrounding vegetation. It is one of the botanical wonders of the Riviera and the Mediterranean! After our visit and lunch, we set off for the garden paradise of Menton.

Located in Europe's mildest climate and sheltered by the high Maritime Alps, orange and lemon trees bloom here even in winter. (It is said that Menton's first lemons were planted by Eve.) Picture-postcard pretty and with year-round seaside sunshine, Menton is where the British inadvertently invented the French Riviera. When the widowed monarch Queen Victoria arrived in 1882, the city already boasted 5,000 British residents busy building mansions and planting tropical gardens. Enjoy a stroll on the promenade and relax in your beautiful surroundings.

About Menton, France: A Garden Paradise

"My city is a garden" - The slogan for the city was not chosen at random. With an exceptionally mild climate and 316 days of sunshine a year, Menton is a paradise for botanists who have acclimatized exotic plants from far away destinations. The subtropical species flourish and grow at ease in sun-soaked Menton.





Soak in the beauty of the Côte d'Azur

DAY 5: September 18 - Hanbury Gardens & the Gardens of Menton

We begin the day at Clos du Peyronnet, a hidden hillside haven lovingly tended by the Waterfield family. A short drive takes us to the Jardin Serre de la Madone, once the winter retreat of Lawrence Johnston (creator of Hidcote). Winding terraces and rare plants now flourish once more, thanks to the devotion of plant lovers from around the world.

After a leisurely lunch in Menton, we cross briefly into Italy to wander the Hanbury Botanical Gardens, a UNESCO-listed treasure overlooking the sea. Founded in 1867 by Thomas Hanbury as a sanctuary for botanical discovery, it is now nurtured by the University of Genoa. We return to our elegant seaside hotel in time for an evening at leisure. Sleep in Menton at Hotel Royal Napoléon (B, L)

DAY 6: September 19 - A Garden Stroll Through Monaco

This morning we set off for Monaco, jewel of the Riviera. Though small in size, its history and splendor are immense—home to the Grimaldi family for over 700 years. From the palace hilltop, sweeping views reveal the sparkling bay and terraced city below. We meander through Monaco's exquisite gardens, where roses perfume the air, exotic succulents cling to cliffside paths, and Japanese maples cast delicate shadows. Even the esplanades bloom



with artistry. Highlights include the famed Exotic Garden and its underground cave. We pause at Princess Grace's serene resting place before returning to Menton. Sleep in Menton at Hotel Royal Napoléon (B, L)



DAY 7: September 20 - From the Côte d'Azur to Arles via St-Jean-Cap-Ferrat

This morning, we journey west along the glittering Riviera to the exquisite Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild, perched on St-Jean-Cap-Ferrat. The gardens unfold like a living tapestry—Spanish, Florentine, Japanese, Provençal—each a scene unto itself. A formal French water garden stretches toward a temple ringed with Aleppo pines, while the villa's interiors hold Beatrice Ephrussi's opulent collections, explored via a self-guided audio tour.

We continue to Aix-en-Provence, a city born of Roman springs and known for its fountains, golden stone, and artistic spirit. After a brief walking tour and a bit of free time, we head to Arles, our home for the next four nights.

Sleep in Arles at Hôtel du Forum (B, D)

DAY 8: September 21 - A Day with Van Gogh in Arles

Sleep in or begin the day with a quiet stroll. Later this morning, join your guide for an evocative walk through Arles, a town where Roman columns, medieval chapels, and bold modern art coexist. Seven UNESCO World Heritage sites trace its ancient past, while its streets hum with artistic energy—Van Gogh's brushwork still echoing in the light, alongside cutting-edge photography galleries and installations.

After lunch together, the afternoon is yours—to wander Roman ruins, linger in cafés, or simply savor the atmosphere. Sleep in Arles at Hôtel du Forum (B, L)

DAY 9: September 22 – In Van Gogh's Footsteps: St-Paul-de-Mausole and St-Rémy Today, we travel into the Provençal hills to St-Paul-de-Mausole, a tranquil Romanesque monastery beside the ancient ruins of Glanum. Within its quiet cloister garden, Van Gogh once found peace and painted some of his most beloved works. The grounds, still a working psychiatric clinic, honor his legacy with blooms that recall his canvas—irises, cypresses, and golden light.

Nearby, in the village of Eygalières, we visit the Jardin de l'Alchimiste, a symbolic garden inspired by the ancient art of transformation. Designed by Ossart & Maurières, its three "magical" gardens—black, white, and red—echo the alchemical journey toward immortality. A private garden visit is also planned before we return to Arles for a relaxed, independent evening. Sleep in Arles at Hôtel du Forum (B, L)





Enjoy the rich history and fragrances of Provence

DAY 10: September 23 - The Pont du Gard, an ancient Roman Masterpiece The amazing Pont du Gard was built shortly before the Christian era to allow the aqueduct of Nîmes (which is almost 31 miles long) to cross the Gard River. The Roman architects and hydraulic engineers who designed this bridge, which stands almost 150 feet high and is on three levels - the longest measuring 900 feet long - created a technical and artistic masterpiece.

After our visit, we'll enjoy a wine tasting at a nearby estate followed by a delicious Provencal farewell feast. Sleep in Arles at the Hôtel du Forum (B, L)

DAY 11: September 24 - Your Journey Culminates in Arles

Your garden journey concludes this morning. There is a train station in Arles that links to many major cities in France. You may want to consider booking a flight home from Marseilles, allowing enough time (1.5 hours) to reach the airport from Arles. Or zoom north to Paris on the TGV train. You are just hours away from the City of Light.
