DAY 0: Depart the U.S. for London

Remember, you'll need to depart from North America no later than May 18 in order to arrive by May 19. If you have time, we suggest arriving a few days early to see a play at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre or visit London's great museums!

DAY 1: Wednesday, May 19 – Your Custom Garden Journey Begins!

Welcome to the United Kingdom! Transfer by train or taxi to your centrally located four-star hotel in London. Take time to relax and freshen up before meeting your guide, your Michigan Public host, and fellow travelers for an evening orientation and welcome dinner.

DAY 2: Thursday, May 20 – A Full Day at the Renowned Chelsea Flower Show

The Chelsea Flower Show is Europe's premier gardening event, showcasing stunning garden designs by some of the world's top horticultural artists. Located on an 11-acre site at the Royal Hospital in Chelsea, this annual event transforms the serene lawns into a vibrant wonderland filled with color and creativity. Since its inception in 1913, the show has played a crucial role in advancing horticultural trends and innovations. In 2002, the event was enhanced with the introduction of the Great Marquees, which are larger, brighter, and better ventilated, offering an improved experience for visitors and exhibitors alike. It's truly a celebration of nature's beauty. Enjoy your visit! *Sleep in London (B, D)*

DAY 3: Friday, May 21 – Churchill's Chartwell Estate

Depart this morning aboard a comfortable motorcoach and learn about Winston Churchill's life and legacy en route to Chartwell. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided tour of the exquisite gardens, including the walled garden, Golden Rose Walk, and lakes, followed by time to explore the house and Churchill's studio at your own pace. Conclude the day with a reserved afternoon tea at the café before returning to the hotel in the late afternoon.

DAY 4: Saturday, May 22 – Sissinghurst and Great Dixter Gardens

Today we explore two of England's most celebrated gardens. Our morning begins at Great Dixter, the former home of plantsman and garden writer Christopher Lloyd. Originally redesigned by Sir Edwin Lutyens using traditional Kentish buildings, the garden became famous for Lloyd's bold, imaginative planting style. His innovative use of mixed borders, meadow gardens, and vibrant combinations of plants transformed Great Dixter into one of the world's most influential gardens. We'll enjoy time to wander its colorful borders, topiary, and distinctive garden rooms.

This afternoon we visit the iconic Sissinghurst Castle Garden, created by writer Vita Sackville-West and diplomat Harold Nicolson. Set among the ruins of an Elizabethan manor, Sissinghurst is divided into a series of intimate garden "rooms," blending Nicolson's formal design with Sackville-West's romantic planting. Highlights include the celebrated White Garden, cottage garden, orchard, and tower, whose panoramic views reveal the garden's elegant layout and enduring influence on garden design. *Sleep in Royal Tunbridge Wells (B, L, D)*



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Spend a day at Hever Castle, the historic home of Anne Boleyn

DAY 5: Sunday, May 23 – Hever Castle and Penshurst Place and Gardens

This morning we are off to Penshurst Place and Gardens. The medieval Baron's Hall was completed in 1341 as a country retreat for the lord mayor of London. The Baron's Hall, crowned by an original 60-foot-high, chestnut beamed ceiling is an unmissable sight for visitors to the ancestral home of the Sidney family, which has cared for the estate since 1552. Explore this grand estate and its lovely gardens before enjoying lunch.

After lunch, we are off to **Hever Castle**. Spanning more than 600 years, the history of Hever Castle is rich and varied. The castle became the childhood home of Anne Boleyn, King Henry VIII's second wife, who became Queen of England for just 1,000 days. Arrive at Royal Tunbridge Wells in the late evening. *Sleep in Royal Tunbridge Wells (B, L, D)*

DAY 6: Monday, May 24 – RHS Garden Wisley

Our journey today continues as we depart for historic Oxford. En route, we'll visit RHS Garden Wisley, the society's historic flagship garden and one of its most horticulturally diverse properties. The Royal Horticultural Society was given Wisley in 1903. From the start, the garden acquired a reputation for its collections of lilies, gentians, Japanese irises, primulas, and water plants. Enjoy a picnic lunch in the gardens and then set off for Oxford. Arrive in Oxford in the late afternoon. Then, join your guide and host for a welcome-to-Oxford dinner. *Sleep in Oxford (B, L, D)*



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Spend four nights in Oxford, our charming home in which to explore the Cotswolds

DAY 7: Tuesday, May 25 – Discover Oxford University and Gardens

This morning, we'll enjoy a student-led tour of the historic colleges of the University of Oxford, or simply "Oxford." It has no known foundation date, but there is evidence of teaching here dating to 1096, making it the oldest university in the English-speaking world and the world's second-oldest university in continuous operation. It grew rapidly from 1167 when Henry II banned English students from attending the University of Paris. After disputes between students and Oxford townsfolk in 1209, some academics fled northeast to Cambridge where they established the University of Cambridge. The two ancient universities are collectively known as Oxbridge. Lovers of literature will enjoy seeing the colleges and pubs where C. S. Lewis, J. R. R. Tolkien, and Lewis Carroll wrote their masterpieces.

Our tour also includes the University of Oxford Botanic Garden. Founded in 1621 with a mission to promote learning and glorify nature, many people and plants have been involved in the history of the garden. The educational and conservation missions continue to this day. You can visit the herbaceous borders, glasshouses or simply relax in the oldest botanic garden in Britain. *Sleep in Oxford (B, D)*





Blenheim, the historic birthplace of Winston Churchill

DAY 8: Wednesday, May 26 – Sir Winston Churchill and Blenheim Palace

This morning we set out to discover Winston Churchill’s life at Blenheim Palace. We’ll explore the newly reinvigorated permanent Churchill exhibition, visit the memorial garden and walk in Churchill’s footsteps.

Blenheim is the English landscape garden at its most monumental, an appropriate setting for the magnificent palace. The grounds were originally designed in the early 18th century and later renovated by English landscape architect Lancelot Brown, who swept away all traces of the earlier formality, replacing it with his signature landscape park. He also installed the lake and cascade.

In the afternoon, we continue to Rousham Gardens. Rousham provides a complete contrast in scale and atmosphere and is disarmingly uncommercial. The garden was designed by William Kent in 1738 for Sir Robert Dormer, and since then, it has remained miraculously unaltered and in the same family. We’ll return to Oxford in the late afternoon.

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Enjoy a day in the Cotswolds

DAY 9: Thursday, May 27 – The Cotswolds and Hidcote Manor Garden

Today, we'll discover one of the most beautiful gardens in the Cotswolds. Our day starts with a visit to the charming town of Chipping Campden in the Cotswolds. Enjoy time for lunch and browse the village's charming boutiques and shops.

After lunch, we are off to Hidcote Manor and Garden. Hidcote is one of the most influential and famous of all English gardens. Hidcote was created in the 1930s by American horticulturist Lawrence Johnston. Johnston employed his skills as a designer and a horticulturist to make a superbly dramatic garden of outdoor rooms, each with a theme or particular season of interest. The garden is packed with wonderful plantings and visual surprises.

In the late afternoon we make our way back to our home in Oxford. *Sleep in Oxford (B, D)*

DAY 10: Friday, May 28 – Your Custom Garden Journey Concludes

Your garden journey concludes this morning after breakfast. Oxford is well connected by train, airport shuttle and bus to London. Heathrow Airport is just a little over an hour away by direct shuttle bus. In addition, there are many wonderful things to see in Oxford, so consider booking an additional evening or two here. Return home with a lifetime of happy memories of your garden adventure! (B)
