

Day 1-2: Dublin – Literary **Legends & Garden Strolls** 

Begin your Irish journey in Dublin, a city rich in literary and musical heritage. Settle into your central 4-star hotel, then enjoy a welcome dinner with your host, Suzanne Bona, and fellow travelers. Explore historic neighborhoods, Georgian squares, and lush gardens on guided walks. Discover echoes of Yeats, Joyce, and Beckett, alongside traditional classical music. Enjoy a visit to the James Joyce Centre and Trinity College to see the Long Room Library and the Book of Kells. Enjoy some free time and explore galleries, bookshops, and cafés, with an evening featuring a live musical performance.



## Day 3-4: Kilkenny – Medieval Splendor & the Rock of Cashel

Venture south to Kilkenny, a medieval gem with a vibrant arts scene. En-route from Dublin we will visit the and Irish National Stud & Gardens. Then, we are off to Kilkenny!

A guided tour reveals its winding lanes, Gothic architecture, and tucked-away gardens. Kilkenny's deep connection to folklore and storytelling makes it a haven for literary discovery. One afternoon includes an excursion to the Rock of Cashel—an iconic, windswept fortress rich in history and myth. Enjoy a group dinner, enhanced by an intimate musical performance—an evening designed immerse you in the intersection of Irish heritage and harmony.





This region, often described "Heaven's Reflex," offers serene gardens, lakeside walks, and historic manor visits. A full-day tour along the Dingle Peninsula unveils Ireland's wild beauty-rugged cliffs, ancient beehive huts, and timeless villages. Back in Killarney, explore its national park and soak in the slower rhythms of the Irish countryside. Evenings here may include cozy local storytelling, and musical interludes celebrating the region's deep-rooted musical traditions.

## Day 8-9: Galway - The West's **Creative Heartheat**

Travel from Killarney to Galway through the countryside that inspired poets and composers alike. Along the way, pause at a historic literary site connected to W.B. Yeats. Once in Galway, a city known for its creative energy, enjoy a warm welcome with local music and shared stories. Explore the nearby Cliffs of Moher and the Burren, landscapes that have stirred the imagination for centuries. Evenings are filled with great conversation, classical melodies, and a final festive farewell to cap our Irish journey.
