

Your Garden Adventure Begins!

Day 1: Tuesday, February 3 - Arrive in Costa Rica

Pura Vida! Today your garden adventure begins as you arrive in San Jose. Airport transfers are included if arriving today. Meet your Earthbound Expeditions guide and host, Minor Alfaro and Ian Cooke, and fellow travelers for a welcome gathering followed by dinner this evening. *Sleep in San Jose (D)*

Day 2: Wednesday, February 4 – La Selva Biological Station

After a healthy, breakfast we visit La Selva Biological Station. La Selva Biological Station is a protected area encompassing 4,000 acres of low-land tropical rain forest in northeastern Costa Rica. It is owned and operated by the Organization for Tropical Studies, a consortium of universities and research institutions from the United States, Costa Rica, and Puerto Rico. *Sleep in San Jose. (B, L, D)*

Day 3: Thursday, February 5 - Stunning Beaches Via Sarchi

On our journey to the Pacific Coast, we'll stop in the charming town of Sarchí, widely known as the craft capital of Costa Rica. Here, we'll visit the historic ox cart factory, where colorful, hand-painted ox carts—an enduring symbol of Costa Rican culture—are still made using traditional methods. You'll have a chance to observe the intricate craftsmanship and explore local artisan shops offering wood carvings, souvenirs, and vibrant art.

After lunch in the area, we continue on to the sun-drenched Pacific Coast, where we'll dine this evening on seafood specialties. *Sleep near Manuel Antonio National Park (B, D)*



Days 4 & 5: Friday and Saturday, February 6 & 7 - Manual Antonio National Park

Manuel Antonio is one of the best parks to visit for wildlife observation. Howler, squirrel, spider and white-faced monkeys all inhabit the park. Two-toed and three-toed sloths are abundant as are raccoons, coatis, pacas, anteaters, and occasionally ocelots. There are many reptiles including crocodiles, iguanas, boa constrictors and many lizards. Over 350 bird species have been identified within the park including toucans, aracaris, various parrots and parakeets, hummingbirds, trogons and more.

Your guide will be offering daily morning walks along the beach and through the forests. The afternoon is yours. Enjoy a good book, a tropical drink, a siesta or head to the beach.

For those who prefer a more active day, you may wish to set out on a hike or simply discover the joy of body surfing in the warm waters of the Pacific Ocean.

Sleep near Manuel Antonio National Park (B)

Day 6: Sunday, February 8 – Journey to Monteverde and Cloud Forest Wonders

After breakfast, we bid farewell to the beach and travel to the mystical heights of Monteverde, perched at 4,662 feet above sea level. As we arrive in the Cloud Forest, mist and fog cling to the treetops, nourishing one of the world's most biodiverse ecosystems – home to over 100 species of mammals, 400 birds, and thousands of plant and insect species.

Upon arrival, we'll check into our mountain hotel. Depending on time and weather, you'll have the chance to join a sunset birdwatching walk with your guide – a peaceful way to close out the day immersed in nature. *Sleep in Monteverde (B, D)*

Day 7: Monday, February 9 – Cloud Forest Exploration & Orchid Garden Delights

This morning, get ready for a guided nature walk through the lush Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve, where your guide will help spot elusive wildlife – including, if we're lucky, the vibrant Resplendent Quetzal. Then we'll stop at the nearby Hummingbird Gallery to observe these tiny, dazzling birds in action.

After lunch, we'll visit the Monteverde Orchid Garden, which showcases 426 species of orchids in bloom. Learn about these fascinating flowers and the delicate ecosystems they depend on. The remainder of the afternoon is free – explore more of Monteverde on your own or unwind at the lodge before we gather for a relaxing group dinner.

Sleep in Monteverde (B, L, D)

Day 8: Tuesday, February 10 – Depart for San Jose

Depart Monteverde this morning for San Jose. En-route we'll stop for lunch and then visit the Else Kientzler Botanical Gardens. The botanical garden is home to over 2,000 different plants from around the world. Enjoy a walking tour of the gardens. Then, in the late afternoon we arrive at our hotel in San Jose.

Tonight, enjoy a farewell dinner. *Sleep in San Jose (B, D)*
