YOUR CLASSICAL JOURNEY BEGINS...

Day 0: Depart the USA

Be sure to depart the USA on or before June 9.

Day 1: Wednesday, June 10 - Arrive in Romantic Venice

Bursting with baroque cathedrals, palaces, outdoor markets, islands and piazzas, Venice is the perfect place for us to begin our musical journey of Italy. Home to Casanova, Vivaldi and Marco Polo, Venice was the single most powerful city state in 13th century Europe. With an economy equal to that of France it is no wonder Shakespeare located his "merchants" in Venice.

Upon arrival, we'll be met by our guide and escorted to our centrally located hotel. This evening, join hosts Maestro Anthony Barrese and KHFM's Alexis Corbin, your guide and fellow travelers for a welcome orientation and a Venetian feast fit for Casanova himself. Sleep in the heart of Venice (D)

Dining in Italy - A Culinary Note

Italian cuisine is all about rich flavors and joyful indulgence. After years of experience, we've found the best way to enjoy a traditional multi-course meal is to make lunch the star of the day.

Day 2: Thursday, June 11 - In Vivaldi's Footsteps

This morning, we explore infinite alleyways, the Rialto market, and the Piazza San Marco with our local guide. These are the very streets where Vivaldi and Marco Polo used to stroll. Together we'll learn why Venice was one of the great centers for the arts in the 15th, 16th and 17th centuries.

You're then free to take in as many of the 125 islands of Venice as you can. Glass lovers will want to hop a ferry to nearby Murano. Other options include the Doge's Palace, an exploration of the Basilica San Marco or an ascent of the towering Campanile (bell tower) for a bird's eye view of the famous Piazza San Marco. Sleep in Venice (B)

Day 3: Friday, June 12 - World Class Art and La Fenice!

Today you'll be accompanied by a local historian for an exploration of one of Europe's greatest museums. The Accademia Museum collection includes stunning works by Renaissance masters Titian, Tintoretto, Da Vinci and Piero della Francesca.

Enjoy a traditional Venetian lunch together. Spend the afternoon exploring Venice before meeting your hosts for a pre-concert talk about Donizetti's Enrico di Borgogna, to be performed at the historic La Fenice Opera House. Enjoy an independent dinner in Venice this evening. Sleep in Venice (B, L)

About Teatro La Fenice

Founded in 1792, Teatro La Fenice is one of the most renowned landmarks in the history of Italian theatre and opera. Especially in the 19th century, La Fenice became the site of many famous operatic premieres at which the works of several of the four major bel canto era composers—Rossini, Bellini, Donizetti, and Verdi were performed including Verdi's La traviata!





-Act II -

DAY 4: Saturday, June 13 - Romantic Verona and Verdi's Celebrated, La traviata After breakfast, we depart Venice. Our first stop will be a delightful wine estate where we can enjoy a tasting and a traditional lunch. Then, in the late afternoon, we will arrive in Verona. In time to relax before attending this evening's performance Verdi's La traviata at the ancient Roman Arena. Sleep in Verona (D)

DAY 5: Sunday, June 14 - Discover Romantic Verona

This morning we'll meet with an informative local guide and set out to explore the heart of Verona. Our walking tour will include the Roman Arena where you'll see one great opera, and a visit to Fondazione Arena di Verona's Museum (AMO). Strolling through thirty rooms, the museum introduces one of the arts that makes Verona world-famous: opera. The AMO unveils the creative process which brings an opera to the stage. Librettos, photographs, letters, scores, sketches, set design and costume designs display the striking work of the elements which lead to the genesis of an opera.

Our guided tour continues to the Piazza delle Erbe. Enjoy a multi-course lunch together featuring regional specialties. The rest of day is dedicated to La Dolce Far Niente, which means the "sweetness of doing nothing." Or you may wish to visit Padre Filippini church, where Maria Callas was married in 1949. Sleep in Verona (B, L)

About Verona's Roman Arena: After the Colosseum in Rome and the amphitheater in Capua, the Roman arena in Verona is the third largest. With its gigantic dimensions of 140 meters in length and 110 meters in width it dominates the Piazza Brà from the north. Its great acoustics and unique location make the Roman arena the ideal location for an evening opera performance.

DAY 6: Monday, June 15 - In Pursuit of Stradivarius and Monteverdi

Upon our arrival in Cremona, we set out to explore the life and times of Monteverdi. We'll tour a violin workshop to learn how these beautiful instruments are crafted and then walk over to the museum. Along the way, we'll pay our respects to the world's first opera composer, Monteverdi.

Enjoy lunch in Cremona before setting off for Italy's culinary capital, Bologna! Sleep in Bologna (B, L)

DAY 7: Tuesday, June 16 - Colorful Markets and Ancient Instruments

Begin the day in Bologna with a local guide who will lead you through the city's hidden gems: historic architecture, lively student neighborhoods, and artisanal food spots. Sample regional specialties from historic bottegas and explore the medieval market, where you'll see (and taste) mortadella, ciccioli, sausages, and handcrafted chocolates.

After lunch, visit the Civico Museo Bibliografico Musicale, home to one of the world's top collections of musical instruments and manuscripts. Highlights include Rossini's Barber of Seville, Mozart's failed Bologna exam, and portraits of Vivaldi and Farinelli. End the day with a private concert after the museum closes to the public. Sleep in Bologna (B, L)

Day 8: Wednesday, June 17 - In the footsteps of Verdi, Toscanini and Pavarotti After breakfast we set out to learn about three of Emilia Romagna's sons, Verdi, Pavarotti and Toscanini.

Our musical journey north begins in Busseto, birthplace of Verdi. There we'll have lunch in a restaurant frequented by Luciano Pavarotti. After, enjoy a stunning opera recital in the very room where Verdi studied, and a tour of Verdi's cottage birthplace.

Then we continue through the Po River Valley to Modena. Gastronomy is of such importance here that the region is called "Food Valley" and gourmet travelers arrive like gastro-pilgrims to the region. Before returning to Bologna we'll stop to pay our respects to Toscanini! Sleep in Bologna (B, L)

DAY 9: Thursday, June 18 - East to the World Heritage site of Ravenna

This morning we depart for Ravenna, one of the most unusual towns in Italy. As the capital of the Western Roman Empire, the Visigoth Empire, and the Byzantine Empire under Emperor Justinian and Empress Theodora, Ravenna became one of the greatest cities on the Mediterranean. The city achieved its cultural peak as part of the Byzantine Empire between the 6th and 8th centuries, and it is known for its many well-preserved mosaics created during that time - the finest in all of Western art and the most splendid outside Istanbul. Although it now looks much like any other Italian city, the low Byzantine domes of Ravenna's churches still evoke its Eastern past. Enjoy a tour of the richly decorated Basilica di San Vitale and the Mausoleum di Galla Placidia with an expert local guide.

A traditional multi-course lunch is included today. Before departing let's stop to pay our respects to Italy's greatest poet and author, Dante, by visiting his mausoleum. We'll return to Bologna in time for an independent dinner. Sleep in Bologna (B, L)

DAY 10: Friday, June 19 - Return home with a lifetime of memories! Your classical music adventure concludes this morning after breakfast.

Maestro Anthony Barrese has earned accolades as both a composer and a conductor. He is the recipient of the 2007 Georg Solti Foundation U.S. award for young conductors. As Artistic Director of Opera Southwest he has performed Rossini's Otello with the American staged

premiere of the finale lieto, and in 2014 he lead the new World Premiere of Amleto, not heard anywhere since 1871. The Opera Southwest's 2016-17 season includes Rossini's rarely performed William Tell, Bellini's Norma and a World Premiere production based on Rodolfo Anaya's bestselling novel, Bless Me, Ultima. She performs with diverse ensembles throughout New Mexico including Santa Fe Symphony, Opera Southwest, New Mexico Philharmonic, Links! Percussion Ensemble, Vespus Marimba Band, and steel pan ensemble Sol Calypso. Past performances include engagements with the New York Gilbert and Sullivan



Players, Bill Evans Dance Company, and Kawambe-Omowale African Drum and Dance Theater. An advocate for childhood music education, Alexis was the founding Program Director of the New Mexico Philharmonic's Young Musician Initiative (the first and only El Sistema USA program in New Mexico). She is a former member of the Santa Fe Opera Youth Programming Advisory board, and a current member of the Governing Council of the Public Academy for Performing Arts.
