YOUR CLASSICAL JOURNEY BEGINS


DAY 0 MARCH 31, 2024: DEPART FOR PARIS

In order to arrive on time, you'll need to depart North America no later than March 31.

DAY 1 APRIL 1: ARRIVE IN PARIS

Our journey through Paris and Normandy officially begins in

historic Paris. Board the ship in the afternoon, enjoy a ship orientation, and settle into your elegant accommodations. This evening enjoy a welcome dinner, with your hosts and Earthbound Expeditions guides. Sleep on board. (D).



DAY 2 APRIL 2: MONET'S GARDENS

Over This morning we set out for Giverny, the village where Claude Monet lived and found the inspiration for his Water Lilies. You'll see the gardens in all their glorious splendor and have time to walk beneath the weeping willow and the

little green bridge immortalized in his paintings. You'll also tour his charming home, filled with the objects and art he loved. Stroll the village of Giverny before returning to the MS Renoir for dinner. (B,L,D)





DAY 3 APRIL 3: THE SEASIDE TOWN OF HONFLEUR

Honfleur, a town of painters and Impressionism, possesses that something extra that makes it irresistible. The changing light on the Seine estuary inspired Courbet, Monet, Boudin and many others. Today dozens of galleries and artists' studios continue to display a wide choice of classical and modern paintings. Sleep on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 4 APRIL 4: THE D-DAY BEACHES OR BAYEUX

After breakfast, begin your full-day tour to the historic beaches of Normandy. Drive past Gold Beach, Courseulles sur Mer and Juno Beach on your way to visit such World War II landmarks as Omaha Beach and the American Military Cemetery. For those who prefer a slower day, there will be an option to visit Bayeux and its famous tapestry and other more leisurely pursuits. The choice is yours! Have dinner and relax aboard the ship tonight or take an evening stroll. Sleep on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 5 APRIL 5: A DAY IN ROUEN

The city of Rouen, which stretches along the Seine, is Normandy's cultural, historic, gastronomic, and vibrant capital. Monet's canvases of the cathedral have made it the best-loved building in town, but many other glories stand out, including fine museums and the church dedicated to tragic visitor Joan of Arc. It was here in the 14th century courthouse where Joan of Arc was sentenced to death and on the nearby Market Square where she was burned at the stake. Sleep on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 APRIL 6: A DAY WITH VAN GOGH AND JOSEPHINE BONAPARTE

Famous for its many visiting painters (Cézanne, Daubigny, Pissarro, Corot, Van Gogh), and as the burial place of Vincent Van Gogh and his brother, Theo, Auvers-sur-Oise is located just 25km north of Paris. Enjoy a stroll of the village's highlights. After lunch, join an excursion to the Chateau de Malmaison, the former residence of Empress Joséphine de Beauharnais, wife of Napoléon Bonaparte. Your local guides will regale you with stories about the history of the estate and the famously passionate and stormy relationship of Joséphine and Napoléon. Return to our ship for dinner. Sleep on board (B,L,D)

DAY 7 APRIL 7: VERNON: CIDER TASTING AND DOMAINE DE VILLARCEAUX

Enjoy a walk in the Domaine de Villarceaux, a stunning chateau surrounded by magnificent gardens. We'll also taste the pride of Normandy: cider and Calvados. Made typically with apples, but also pears on occasion, French cider is a refreshing beverage for the over 21 crowd. Think of Calvados as cider's aged sister, in the form of brandy, which makes a good (consumable) souvenir of France. This evening, enjoy a gourmet feast as we cruise overnight to Paris. Sleep on board. (B,L,D)

DAY 8 APRIL 8: FLAVORS OF PARIS

This morning, local experts will treat you to a walking tour of the highlights of Paris. Meals will be enjoyed





independently today and we'll meet up for an included concert tonight (or tomorrow, TBA). Sleep in Paris (B)

DAY 9 APRIL 9: THE OPERA GARNIER

Tour the beautiful Opera Garnier this morning followed by a festive farewell lunch together. The afternoon is yours to further explore Paris or relax and people watch in a café. (B,L)

DAY 10 APRIL 10: DEPART PARIS OR, JOIN MPR'S PERFORMANCE TODAY HOST FRED CHILD ON THE RHONE RIVER!

Return to the USA today, or join MPR Performance Today host, Fred Child on a classical cruise on the Rhone River. Discover the land of Van Gogh and Picasso! Explore Roman ruins, sunny open-air markets and enjoy wine tastings in Provence and Burgundy! *Custom cruise dates with MPR's Fred Child are April 11- 20! (B)

YOUR RIVER SHIP: MS RENOIR


