Your Journey Begins!

Day 1: Saturday, January 17 - Arrival Day

Arrive in Mexico City, where the sun's warmth the vibrant invites relaxation and energy revitalizes your spirit. Meet your travel companions for an orientation and welcome dinner with your hosts and your Earthbound guides.



Explore the vibrant Centro Historico, Mexico City's cultural heart. Visit the Zócalo, home to landmarks like the Metropolitan historical Cathedral and National Palace with Diego Rivera's murals. Discover the Templo Mayor ruins and Casa de Los Azulejos. Marvel at the Postal Palace and Palacio de Bella Artes. Enjoy dinner and drinks.

Day 3: Monday, January 19 - Floating Gardens of Xochimilco

Start with a sensory adventure at Mercado Merced, discovering key Mexican ingredients. Then, cruise the vibrant Xochimilco canals, remnants of Aztec waterways, aboard a festive trajinera boat. Enjoy micheladas, snacks, and mariachi music. Return to the hotel to relax before a delightful garden dinner.







Chapultepec, home to museums, historic sites, and stunning views. Visit the Museo Nacional de Antropología and in Coyoacán, visit the Frida Kahlo Museum, and savor a local food tour with tacos and mezcal.



Depart early for Teotihuacan, home to massive pyramids. Experience a breathtaking hot air balloon ride at sunrise over the Pirámide del Sol and Pirámide de la Luna. After landing, enjoy a champagne toast and breakfast, then explore the ancient site on foot, learning about its mysterious builders.



The murals at Mexico City's Secretaría de Educación Pública, painted by Diego Rivera from 1923-1928, showcase vibrant market scenes, labor, and national pride. Over 100 panels celebrate Mexico's festivals, industries, and people, while addressing themes of nation-building, indigenismo, modernization, and socialist politics, defining the Mexican Mural Renaissance.
