Pastor John's Jottings "Would you hold, please?"

One of the frustrations of modern life is the automatic answering machines that businesses use. You call with a question that you know the automatic system canot help you with. But first you have to go through two or three rounds of \tilde{o} To hear the balance on your bill, press 1, to hear the last payment on your bill, press 2, etc. \tilde{o} Finally you come to the part about a representative and then invariably, you are placed on hold. Sometimes they play soft music while you are on hold, but, if you are like me, that doesnot really help calm you.



As Christians we are thankful that God doesnot use an automatic answering machine. When we pray, God hears us right then. No need to push buttons to get the right connection, God answers every prayer personally. Still there are times when it seems that God has placed us on hold.

In Mark 5:21-43 a man named Jairus, one of the leaders of the synagogue, came to Jesus and asked him to help his little daughter. She was very ill even to the point of dying. Jesus agrees to go with Jairus, but along the way a woman with a hemorrhage touches his cloak and is healed by Jesus. Jesus stops for a conversation with the woman. In effect, Jesus has put Jairus on hold.

We are not told how Jairus reacts to this interruption. No doubt he is very anxious to get Jesus back to his house and his sick daughter. Still he has no choice but to wait. Then Jairusøworst fears are realized. While Jesus is õwasting time,ö talking to this woman, the news comes that Jairusø daughter has died.

In my imagination, I see Jesus placing an arm around Jairusøshoulders and assuring him that there is still plenty of time. Indeed Jesus is able to heal the girl and bring her back to life.

We dongt know how Jairus reacted to being put on hold, but the real question is: õHow will we react?ö Unlike the earthly Jesus, the Risen Christ can be in all places at all times. So when we feel like he has put us on hold, it is not because he is busy elsewhere. So why then does it seem like sometimes, God puts us on hold?

It may be that the circumstances are not right for the answer God wants to give us. So we must wait. It may be that we are not yet ready to receive the good answer that God wants to give us. So we must wait. It may be that there are reasons only God knows. Still we must wait.

Most of us dongt like to wait. However, while we wait, we can be assured that the wait is not because God didngt hear us. God always hears our prayers. The wait is not because God doesngt love us. God proved his love for us 2000 years ago when Jesus died on the cross for us.

So while we sometimes must wait, as Christians we can do so with faith and confidence. When the time is right, God will act. Humans are often late and sometimes forget altogether. God never forgets. God always acts in love. And God is always right on time.
