

# PASTOR JOHN'S JOTTINGS

Dr. J. Vernon McGee talks about growing up in Santa Monica. As boys they used to play a game called "jumping to Catalina Island." It is about 25 miles directly out from the Santa Monica pier to Catalina Island. In the summer when it was hot, the boys would take turns jumping off the pier to see who could jump the farthest. It was a fun way of cooling off.

Dr. McGee points out that some of the boys jumped higher than others. Some of the boys jumped farther than the others. But no one ever actually jumped to Catalina Island! Humanly speaking that is impossible. One would have to have a boat or a bridge to get to the island.


Dr. McGee uses this as an example of what Jesus did for us. We cannot work our way into salvation. Some people do more good works than others. Some people do greater and more sacrificial things than others. But no one makes the leap to salvation by himself.

This month we will celebrate the bridge that Jesus built for us to the kingdom of God. We will remember Jesus' death and we will celebrate his resurrection. He died for us, because we couldn't get there on our own. He rose for us, because death could not hold him. In his resurrection we see our own resurrection. In his life, we have life.

Jesus said, "I come that they might have life and have it more abundantly." (John 10:10) And so we worship and so we celebrate. Happy Easter!


