- -With the upsurge in the Covid-19 cases, Terra is not doing the young kids Sunday afternoon program for a couple of weeks.
- -In keeping with the Governor's order, everyone is wearing a mask during worship at all times.
- -We will have two Christmas Eve worship services, one at 12:30 p.m. and one at 11:00 p.m. with communion served at the late one.
- -Annual staff reviews were conducted. We are thankful for the great work that our staff is doing and we appreciate them very much!
- -At his request, Lance's job description has been changed from 5.5 to 6 hours per week for church cleaning.
- -Update on progress on fund for better video broadcasting equipment in Donna Smith's name. Bryon, Ginger, and Pastor John met with the video operator at First Fairmont and looked at their set-up. We will continue to research possibilities and costs.
- -We received \$1000.00 from Meadowbrook Children's Charity toward our Hygiene Kit mission. We also received a number of donations from the congregation. The task force and the youth group put together 40 kits Sunday, November 15.
- -Elected Jeep Wilson to be our commissioner to presbytery for the November 19th meeting.



We plan to have two Christmas Eve Candlelight Services this year. The first one will be at 12:30 in the afternoon and the second one will be at 11:00 at night. Communion will be celebrated at the 11:00 service. The 12:30 service is a new time for us. Last year we had a good turnout at 3:00 p.m., but the concern has been raised about people who are on shift work that were not able to make either service. So we moved that service to 12:30 p.m. We hope that maybe some of the people who are here at the church preparing for the Christmas dinner will be able to just stay for the service. We also think that those who only work half a day on Christmas Eve, might find the 12:30 service convenient.

So this is where you can help us. Charla and I are talking about doing a skit as Mary and Joseph for the 12:30 service. This is such a familiar story and we are looking for some new approaches and new ideas to bring it to life. We are asking you to prayerfully consider what you hear God saying to us in the passage from Luke 2 and then give us some feedback on the following questions. Will you help us in this way?

What about Mary and Joseph do you find inspiring and worthy of imitating?

What do you think was hardest for them? What was most exciting?

If you had been in their place, what might you have done?

The Bible tells us very little about the characters of Mary and Joseph. We know that they were faithful and devoted, but little beyond that. Was Joseph older and rather grumpy? Did Mary wear rose-colored glasses? Did they complain about their parents? Did Joseph make jokes about his mother-in-law? Did Mary tease Joseph about being too cautious and overly serious? Did Joseph dream of becoming a famous carpenter and building palaces? What did Mary dream about? Did they talk to each other about how this baby would change their lives? Can you imagine them telling each other "knock, knock jokes"?

The Advent wreath is a symbol of watchfulness and increasing joy as we anticipate Jesus' birth. The wreath's circular shape symbolizes eternity, or life without end. The candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World — he brought light and life to a dark world (see John 1:4-5). On each of the four Sundays of Advent, we light a new candle. As the light grows, so do our hope and joy







Luke 4:4-14

- $_{\rm 4}$ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee, to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. $_{\rm 5}$ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.
- 6 While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.
- 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.
- 8 In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they


were terrified. 10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for, see- I am bringing you good news of great joy, for all people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12 This will be a sign for you: you will find the child wrapped in bands of cloth, lying in a manger."

- $_{13}$ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying,
 - ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace, among those whom he favors!"
