- -We are trying to get our committees all up and meeting again.
- -The evangelism/fellowship committee will meet after church on January 29th and the fourth Sunday of the month going forward.
- -The new publicity committee will meet after church on February 5th and the first Sunday of each month going forward.
- -The Worship and Music/C.E. committee will meet after church on Feb. 12th and the second Sunday of each month going forward.
- -The Property Committee will meet after church on the 19th and the third Sunday each month going forward.
- -Gave scholarship to Ashleigh Burnett.
- -Approved seven Lenten lunches and services. Cost of the meal \$5.00 (\$4 in 2019)
- -Approved the youth group having a fund raiser potato luncheon before the congregational meeting on Feb. 26th.
- -Bombardiere has installed new motor and pump in furnace room.
- -Received a quote for security cameras from United Sound \$5,861. The property committee will discuss further.
- -Decided to buy three new carpet runners to protect the new flooring in the downstairs hall from snow and salt being tracked onto it.
- -Laundromat and Hygiene Kit ministries are going well.
- -Elected Harriett Northey to be our commissioner to the Feb. 16th Presbytery Meeting.
- -The results of the congregation voting on proposed goals for 2023 were as follows:
- 28 people responded. All five goals received some support. The top goals were:
- 1. "Get the Lenten Lunches going again." 21

2. "Form an advertising committee that will meet monthly to get the word out on the various programs and ministries of the church."

The other three goals were in order of voting:

- 3. "Have at least three prayer or other events using the green space beside the church." 7
- 4. "Begin at least one new outreach ministry to the Palace and/or the Mason House apartments" 7
- 5. "Have at least three set workdays in 2023 to put together Hygiene Kits" 4
- 6. "Add at least one more day per month to the Laundromat ministry." 3
- -An advertising committee was formed. The members will be Denver, Hank, and Jenna.
- -Approved statistical report and thanked Wayne Northey for his good work on the report.
- -Offerings for the lenten meals will be the same as in previous years.

 The first six will go to the Clarksburg Mission and the seventh to Health Access.

- -Officers of the corporation were elected.

Scriptures: Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7


*Matthew 4:1-11

The one that really got me to thinking was this: "When someone loves you, the way they say your name is different. You know that your name is safe in their mouth."

This rings so true for me. It also got me to pondering what our names sound like when God says them. In Isaiah 43:1-2 God says, "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

God not only knows our name and calls us by name, God claims us as his children. "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are." (1 John 3:1)

What does your name sound like when God says it?

One of the most well- known verses in the Bible is John 3:16. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

The promise is that God not only loves us and knows our name. God also loves us enough to die for us. We can be sure that our name is safe in God's mouth.

I invite you to place your name in John 3:16 and hear this verse as personal to you. "God so loved (your name) that he gave his only Son, so that (your name) who believes in him should not perish but (your name) shall have eternal life.

God knows your name, calls you by name, and speaks your name in such a way as to remove all doubt that you are valued and loved.
