## March Scriptures and Sermons

## March 1 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Lent (Communion)

Scriptures: Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7 \*Romans 5:12-19 Sermon Title: "Addiction Escape"

Theme: Paul uses the image of the Old Adam and the New Adam. The Old Adam fell into sin and took us all along for the ride. Christ then is the new Adam. As the first Adam opened the way to sin, so Christ as the new Adam opens the way out. Escaping the slavery of sin is not merely a matter of wanting to do better. We are addicted to sin. The church has set aside the season of Lent because we need time to reflect on our condition. The first step to recovery is admitting that we have a problem and that we can't solve it on our own. There is a way out of sin addiction, but the way out is not under our control. Only Christ has the power to free us.

## March 8 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: \*Psalm 121

Romans 4:1-5, 13-17

Sermon Title: "From Where Will My Help Come?""

Theme: As we travel along this journey we call life, everyone encounters some difficult times. When we are in trouble, who will help us? Who can we always depend on? The psalmist answers with confidence. "My help comes for the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth."

### March 15 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: Exodus 17:1-7 \*Romans 5:1-11

Sermon Title: "Fully Pardoned"

Theme: When someone receives a presidential pardon, that person is not only freed from whatever punishment might have been imposed, their criminal record is also wiped clean. This is the same kind of pardon that we receive from Jesus Christ. Our sins are forgiven and we are made one with God.

## March 22 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: Psalm 23

\*Ephesians 5:8-14

Sermon Title: "Pursued by Goodness and Mercy"

Theme: Psalm 23 with its enduring image of God as the good shepherd is one of the most beloved Psalms. Today we take a fresh look at this old friend. It is possible to translate the Greek words that is usually translated as "followed," as "pursued." Jesus does not merely passively follow us, he pursues us. He told the story of the sheep that is lost and the shepherd that goes looking until he finds the lost sheep. Then brings it back rejoicing. Jesus goes to find us.

# John's Jottings



The English word "Lent" is a shortened form of the Old English word lencten, meaning "spring season." It reflects the well worn path that Christians have traveled down through the centuries when we travel with Christ through the winter of his pain and suffering and then celebrate with him the joy of Spring, new life in his resurrection.

The season of Lent was set in the forth century as being the 46 days leading up to Easter Sunday. (40 days if don't count the Sundays). It is a period of time set aside for serious reflection on our lives and living.

It is most often in times of pain and suffering that we come face to face with questions about the value of life and our goals in living. So when we reflect on the suffering of Christ, it puts our own pains and struggles into perspective. What things are most important to us? What things are using up the most of our time? Are they the same things?


It has been pointed out that we can become slaves to the "urgent things" in our lives. Just because something is urgent, doesn't mean that it is important. The lawn may need to be mowed urgently, but that doesn't make it highly important. Taking time this week to pray and worship God may not seem urgent, but it is highly important. Getting the kids to soccer may be highly urgent, but it is not as important as your spending time with them.

Lent is a season set aside for us to make time to slow down and reflect. We have special services during Lent and individuals are encouraged to spend more time in prayer, Bible reading, and reflection. I say that Lent is set aside. I should say that this is a time for us to deliberately set aside time for prayer and reflection. Because unless we make a deliberate decision to observe the season of Lent, our lives will continue to be driven by the urgent.

We feel most satisfied and fulfilled in life when our life is centered and focused on what is most important. Most of us would agree with that statement. What we tend to forget is that our "default setting," is geared by what we find most urgent. Moreover, trying to keep ahead of the "urgent" leads to feeling stressed out and exhausted.

This Lent I encourage you to accept this season of Lent as a gift from God. Use it to seek God's help on refocusing on what is truly important.
