# John's Jottings

"And it came to pass in those days . . . " (K. J. V. Luke 2:1)

I once heard someone say that their favorite Bible verse was Luke 2:1, "And it came to pass..." He went on to say that he found comfort that things come to pass. They don't come to stay. Good things come and go, so do bad things. And it came to pass...

This pandemic too will pass. God will carry us through. On that we can depend. In the meantime, let me bring you up to date on where we are on various things in the life of the church.

The last time we were able to gather together as a church was on March the 15<sup>th</sup>. On Wednesday, March the 18<sup>th</sup> the session wisely decided to suspend all gatherings at the church. We thought at the time that this would only be for a couple of weeks. Now it looks like it will be a couple of months or more.

One of the positive things about this crisis is that it has been pushing us, especially me, to learn how to use the technology that is available to us. That has been a challenge, but one that will serve us well in the future.

On the Sunday morning worship front, the worship leaders have been gathering each Sunday morning to lead the services that are live streamed on our Facebook page as well as broadcast on WDPX Radio 104.9 FM & 750 AM. A special thank you to Jeanne Harris for playing the piano, to Rev. James A. Harris for his willingness to fill in for the worship leader, to Charla for her help with children's time, and to others who come to be the worship leader or provide special music. A big thank you to Bryon and Ginger Delawder for their tireless efforts to keep us on the radio and to provide the live streaming videos. You do not have to be a member of Facebook to see the service. You can simply enter <a href="www.facebook.com/fpcclarksburg">www.facebook.com/fpcclarksburg</a> in your browser. If you do not want to join Facebook, click on the blue letters that say, "Not Now."

We have had some issues with our live streaming, but it continues to improve. Last Sunday, Bryon purchased a cable that plugs directly from his tablet into the church speaker system. That has helped a lot with the audio quality of the live stream. We are also considering switching internet providers so that we can have a much faster upload speed. That should help with the visual quality of the live stream. The Deacons have also voted to provide up to \$2,000.00 for needed equipment for a better quality video. Hopefully that will also give us the ability to zoom in on whoever is speaking or singing. The live stream will still be affected by the download speed in individual homes, but it should be better overall.

We are thrilled that our live steaming is reaching around 160 people each Sunday. That is far more than the average of 60 who usually come to church. Since we are reaching so many more people we will likely continue

our live streaming even after we can once more meet together.

I do want to take a moment to thank all of our members and friends for your faithfulness and generosity in sending in your offerings to the church. Thank you! In addition, since we are reaching a wider group with the live streaming, we have enrolled with the Presbyterian Foundation so that those who prefer to do so, can give their offerings on line. The cost of doing this is fairly small. The Presbyterian Foundation charges us a 2% administration cost on the gifts they process. There is no monthly or other fee. So if we don't receive any gifts in that fashion, there is no charge for that month. If we are receiving gifts from people who are now watching and have not given in the past, we come out way ahead.

If anyone wants to give online, the easiest way is to go to our web site www.clarksburgfpc.org and click on the "Give online now" button in the white square in the church picture. That will take you directly to our giving page with the foundation. Then just fill out the form and hit send. For those who want to use their mobile phone, you can download the free app "give +" then search for our church by zip code, click on the church name and proceed.

On other fronts, we are starting to have our gatherings by Zoom. This is a teleconferencing program that allows people to join in the conversation either any phone or by computer/smart phone. In addition to our Session and Deacons meetings, our Monday morning prayer group (10:00 A.M.) and our Wednesday afternoon Bible Study (3:30 P.M.) are currently meeting by Zoom. Should you wish to join us for either of those:

#### May 3 Scottish Heritage Sunday

Scriptures: Deuteronomy 26:1-11 \*2 Timothy 1:3-14

Sermon Title: "Standing on the Shoulders of Giants"

# May 17 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Easter

Scriptures: \* Psalm 66:8-20

John 14:15-21

Sermon Title: "Get to the Point"

Theme: The modern mind set has a hard time with the concept of worship and praise. We have a tendency to come to worship with questions like these: What is in it for me? What can I learn from this that I can apply in my day-to-day living? What habits or practices will I embrace or change as a result of the sermon? In other words, we are looking for worship and praise of God to lead us to something else. Yet, in many ways worship/praise is the end we seek. We may feel closer to our girlfriend or boyfriend after we spend time with them. But the goal of spending that time is not so that you will feel closer. The goal is in the time spent itself. So it is with expressions of our love for God. We don't praise God so that it will lead to some other good. We praise God for the sake of praising God!

#### May 24 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Easter

Scriptures: Acts 1:6-14

\*Luke 24:44-53

Sermon Title: "Christ Reigns"

Theme: The story of Christ's ascension to heaven is a strange story. Yet it is important in that it reaffirms that Jesus was and is God. There is no God behind the God we see in Jesus. It is also important that the love and compassion that we see in Jesus is God's love and compassion for us and with us. Furthermore, in the midst of dark times, it is important to realize that the same Jesus who came to give himself for us, also rules. Jesus reigns! He is in ultimate control and we can trust ourselves without fear to him in all

times and places.

#### May 31 Day of Pentecost

Scriptures: Numbers 11:24-30

\*Acts 2:1-21

Sermon Title: "A Sailboat Church"

Theme: On Pentecost the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples with the sound of a mighty wind. The word for wind and spirit are the same in both Greek and Hebrew. Joan Gray, former moderator of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), wrote a book called, "The Sailboat Church." In that book Gray talks about churches who are "Rowboat Churches." These are churches that plan and do things based on their human abilities. These rowboat churches work hard and do some good things. Other churches are "Sailboat Churches." Sailboat churches rely on the power of God's Holy Spirit to move them. They plan and do things based on what the power of God can do. Boats moving under the power of the wind can go much further and make far greater journeys than those who are powered only by muscles and oars. Since the day of Pentecost, the Christian Church has been called to be a sailboat church powered by the wind of God's Spirit.


