ODDS AND ENDS FROM THE CHURCH TREASURER

Pastor's Emergency Fund For many years First Church-Clarksburg has provided its pastors a separate fund for assisting needy members of the community with food, utility and clothing assistance. This worthy extension of our ministry continues with Pastor John determining how best to disburse available funds. Approved requests are forwarded to the church treasurer and checks are disbursed directly to the utility company, grocery store, etc.

If you wish to contribute to the Pastor's Emergency Fund, you are welcomed to include your check in the offering plate. Please make your check payable to First Presbyterian Church and mark "Pastor's Fund" in the note section.

<u>Year-End Contributions</u> Federal tax regulations specify that "...ordinarily, a contribution is made at the time delivery is effected." This means a check dated December 31, 2019 but dropped in the offering plate during January of 2020 is deductible only on the donor's 2020 federal tax return. Exception: a check mailed and postmarked in 2019 may be deducted in 2019 even though the church may not receive it until 2020. Your understanding is appreciated.

<u>What is Per Capita?</u> Per capita is a way for each Presbyterian to share in the administrative expenses of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly. We send WV Presbytery the per capita (\$29.50 for 2019; \$30.00 for 2020) for every member on the active role the prior year.

Approximately 65% stays in WV Presbytery to cover such things as office expenses and programming committee expenses. Approximately 10% is forwarded to the Synod of the Trinity and the remainder goes to General Assembly.

Generally roughly one-quarter of our members send the church an extra amount specifically identified for per capita. If you are willing and financially able, it would be welcomed. Thank you.

<u>One Check (if you prefer)</u> Members are reminded that payments to the church may be combined on one check. For instance, you may consolidate your pledge with a gift to the Christmas Joy Offering or the Pastor's Emergency Fund. Or two weekly pledges may be included on one check. Simply indicate how much is to go to each fund.

Donor Statements Donations to the church are recorded continuously and are easy to retrieve. If you wish to have a printed copy of your year-to-date contributions or wish to know where you stand on your pledge, please contact church treasurer Wayne Northey or the church office.

PASTOR JOHN'S JOTTINGS

"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:20-21)

The four weeks leading up to Christmas Day are known in the church as Advent. Advent is a time of waiting. It is a time to get ready to receive the wonderful gift that God is about to give us.

Admittedly, most of us are not that fond of waiting. We don't like being in the waiting room at the doctor's office. We don't like waiting for the results of the medical test to come back. We don't like waiting to see if we got the new job or the big promotion. Waiting can be difficult.

However, waiting is a part of life and it is a part of a Christian's life. Have you ever wondered why God delayed telling Joseph about Mary's pregnancy? Likely their parents had arranged for Joseph and Mary to get married when they were still children. That was the way it was done in those days. Then when they were old enough to get married, they still had to go through a year of being engaged before the actual marriage.

Matthew tells us the story from Joseph's perspective. Joseph had known for all of his growing up years that he was going to marry Mary. At any time along the way, God could have told Joseph about what was coming. But it was not until Joseph found out that Mary was pregnant from other sources that God acted. Mary's pregnancy was a crisis point for Joseph. He had to decide what to do. He could have publicly denounced her and turned her over to the law, which might well have resulted in her being stoned to death. Instead he decided to quietly divorce her. Only then did God reveal his plan. He wanted Joseph to go ahead and marry Mary and raise the baby as his own. The angel explained that Mary was pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit, she had not committed adultery. It was all part of the plan.

Joseph's story reminds us that God always goes before us setting things in place for his plan. When we are in the waiting rooms of life, things often feel out of control. These are crisis of faith times for us. While things may be out of our control, they are not out of God's control. Our job in those times is to not panic and think that we have to solve everything ourselves. Our job is to remain focused on God and trust that God will provide the answers when the time is right. Our job is to is to accept God's peace and stay faithful while we wait.

When God does reveal his answer to us, our faithful response is to obey. God told Joseph to go ahead and marry Mary, and Joseph did.

I'm reminded of the story from the December issue of Dynamic Preaching of the sky diving instructor. He told his students that when it was their turn, they were to roll out of the door, grab onto the bar, and then wait for his signal to let go. He said, "When I tap you on the helmet, it is time to let go. And when I do, that is **not** the time to start a conversation with me. I don't want this to be like: 'Who me?' 'Yes, you.' 'Let go?' 'Yes!' 'Now?' 'Yes, now!'"

When in the waiting room of life, our job is to trust God and stay faithful. When God reveals his plan, our job is let go of our other plans and obey.
