Report of Treasurer:

Received the treasurer's report showing our income to date is \$26,287 over budget for the year.

Work Camp Implementation Task Force: We have received a request for us to host a work camp the summer of 2022. We are still looking for a work camp coordinator.

Report of Board of Deacons: Minutes for the Deacon meeting on September 13, 2021 were received as information.

Committee and Task Force Reports:

1. Worship and Music/Christian Education

- A. The date for the 2022 Scottish Heritage Sunday will be May 1. Rev. Peter Vial will be our guest preacher that day.
- B. The C.E., Worship & Music committee will consider applications for college and professional degree students for multiple years.

2. Mission Interpretation and Stewardship

- A. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to send \$1,500 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for help with Hurricane Ida. Money to be taken from interest from the R.C. Wilson fund.
- B. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to send \$1,500 to the Clarksburg Mission from R.C. Wilson fund interest.

3. Property Committee.

- A. Update was given on a number of projects the property committee is working on.
- B. We will look into replacing the Chinese Dogwood tree in front of the church. The tree was originally given in memory of Anne Davis' father. Anne has graciously volunteered to pay for a replacement tree.

4. Task Force for Laundromat Ministry

Ministry is going well. We will need to recruit a couple of more teams to fill out the month.

Pastor John's Jottings

In this world you will have trouble, But take heart; I have overcome the world. (John 16:33)



Jesus told his disciples, ". . . .you will have trouble." He didn't say that you may have some inconveniences, not you may have a spot of sorrow now and then. He said, "You will have trouble."

This comes for our Wednesday afternoon Bible Study lesson. The lesson points out that we hear bad news from all kinds of places. Some hear it in the doctor's office. Some hear it from the bank. Some hear it in the courtroom. Some hear it in a phone call in the middle of the night. Some hear it in the media.

There are troubles all around us and some of it is very personal to us. What are we to do with the troubles we encounter in life?

We start by accepting that troubles are a part of life. We can't escape trouble by being a Christian or by living a good life. Encountering trouble in life does not mean that God is out to get you or that God is abandoning you. It is part of life and living.

Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble . . ." But then he continued, ". . . But take heart; I have overcome the world."

Jesus spoke these words to the disciples near the end of his earthly life. These early disciples had plenty of trouble. Some were imprisoned. Some were killed. Many lost their property and were rejected by their communities and family. The disciples made no effort to deny the reality of these troubles. But their focus was not on their troubles, it was on the one who overcame the world.

As our lesson so aptly puts it, "They did not say, 'Look what the world has come to!' rather they said, 'Look at what has come to the world!'"

The good news is not that God will keep all trouble away from our doors. The promise is that God will carry us through those troubles. Our troubles will not defeat us, for we trust in Jesus Christ, the one who has overcome the world.

Someone has pointed out that in the Book of Daniel, chapter 3, we read about Shadrach, Meshack, and Abednego being thrown into the fiery furnace. God did not snatch them back out of the furnace, instead he sent an angel to be with them in the furnace so that they were not burned up. God does not carry us around troubles. God carries us through our troubles.

Whatever trouble you are facing this day, remember that the one we serve is stronger than the world. Christ is stronger than all our troubles.
