Many of us think that Grandparents' Day is another holiday created by greeting card companies, but we are wrong. A West Virginia woman named Marian McQuade saw the importance of sharing heritage and traditions, and she lobbied for the creation of Grandparents' Day as a day to connect generations. McQuade envisioned grandparents and grandchildren spending a day together to celebrate one another and share stories. She suggested that if a person doesn't have living grandparents, then they should adopt surrogate grandparents, and not just for one day, but for a lifetime.

Not only did Marian McQuade not want Grandparents' Day to be commercialized, but she went so far as to refuse payments from greeting card companies. Her desire was for people to spend time together and learn from one another.

This Grandparents' Day, I challenge younger generations to make time to visit with elderly relatives, friends, or neighbors. Listen to their stories, and take delight in the fellowship. I also challenge grandparents to enjoy the day with your grandchildren, and tell them stories from your childhood. Talk them about how things were when you were a kid. There is so much we can learn from one another.



Grandparents' Day was first celebrated in West Virginia in 1973. In 1978 Jimmy Carter proclaimed Grandparents' Day a national holiday, celebrated on the first Sunday after Labor Day.

"And then, what would I do?"


"Well, after many years of hard work you could make enough money to retire and live comfortably. And then if you wanted to, you could come to the beach, relax under a tree and fish all day."

-Affirmed the decision of Beckie and Buddy to approve Jeanne Harris' request for the use of the church for a wedding on August 3rd at 2 p.m. with Rev. James Harris officiating. The couple is Matthew Werry and Jordan Jenson.

-Affirmed the decision of Beckie and Buddy to approved a request from F. Lee West, Church of Our Savior for use of our big candelabras for a wedding on August 17th.

- -Approved the baptism of Alexandria Mitchell, daughter of Robbie and Sarah Mitchell on Sunday, October 20th.
- -Approved the request of The Harrison County Historical Society to provide a place for an AmeriCorps work team to sleep while they work on the Historical Society's building just down the street from us.
