A Critique of Famous Quotes

I'm sure someone is going to say, who am I to criticize
Kissinger, a world famous intellectual. Well, I can say that he does
not have a corner on all knowledge, nor is he always right. Being
an evolution advocate, believing in a groundless "science",
compared to self-evident supernatural creation, is not formidable
opposition (erudition) for me to be concerned with.

Henry Kissinger, on the subject of "truth". "It is not a matter of "what is true", that counts, but a matter of "what is perceived to be true". Like evolution?

A classic contrary case is which is the truth: <u>supernatural</u> <u>creation</u>, or the fantasy of <u>natural evolution</u>? The categories being <u>realism</u> vs. <u>conceptualism!</u>. Judges 21:25.

Not obligated to any equitable standards, or majority-imposed principled laws, the result is a lack of guidance and direction, leading to confusion, and probable anarchy and chaos, and ultimate civil (uncivil) destruction!

Kissinger's pronouncement is his own opinion or philosophy, of which <u>he</u> is the independent judge, or, as quoted above, "right in his own eyes." But, he has no right or license to speak

authoritatively for others to follow his abnormal theories, or assumptions.

To me, Kissinger is either denying personal responsibility to determine and follow the natural dictates of the determinable truths of life, or he purposely and defiantly advocates the throwing off of intellectual and moral constraints in the conduct of personal and societal life. His haughty independence, and condescending, disdainful attitude toward others (lower class than elite), are evident characteristics!

His superiority complex, and unrestrained penchant to publically criticize others, is graphically stated in Kissinger's comment that, "Military men are just dumb, stupid animals to be used as pawns in foreign policy. Spoken in a similar vein of his statement that most of the world's people are "useless eaters" who he and his aberrant cronies would eliminate by a drastic plan of depopulation, which is contained in the futuristic UN Agenda 21 document.

An obvious ruthless exploiter, Kissinger has a typical megalomaniacal personality, which is characterized by a power and wealth driven ambition to forge a ruling role for himself, especially in the one-world government conspiracy, that has been a behind-the-scenes global control movement, existing since the 1700s, originating as the "Bavarian Illuminati", a surreptitiously organized, self-serving dominating elitist class.
