### Recreational League Report: Carol Davis

- 340 participants in Rec league this year (down from 418 last year)
- 39 teams 43 coaches/asst coaches
- Round Robin tournament at the end of the season where players received participation medals and ice cream gift certificates

## Express Coaches' Report:

- Brandon Lamb-U16 boys and U14 girls: U14 girls took first in UT, 3 tournaments (1-2), in the fall we combined the U12-U15 to make a team, the U16 boys played in 3 tournaments (1-2) and took second overall in the fall league
  - Upcoming for older teams: (lots of kids interested but no coach!)
    - Turf Wars, first weekend in Jan, 5v5 tournaments, really fun
    - Casper has a new tournament at the Ranch in late Jan
    - So Utah in late Jan
    - Gillette in Feb
- Mark Hughes-U14 boys: In spring league they won/tied half of their games, had a few rough spring games, fall was a fun season only tied/won half of games, close scores on most games, boys had fun and no one felt too terrible losing, went to two tournaments in Rock Springs won in August and did well in Sept,
  - Mark only coached because no one else would, the funnest thing to watch over the 5 seasons has been seeing the boys get better and figure out what the game is about and how the positions work, etc.
- U12–no team this year
- Eric Swensen-U10: John Richards reporting: spring league 7-2, the 2 losses shouldn't have happened, Park City tournament 1-2, first time playing 9v9 so there was a learning curve, tough tournament but didn't get crushed on the losses, odds not in favor but held own, no league play in fall

Express Fee Schedule Breakdown: Jenna Schneider and Maia Farrens

- The season for EYSC is August 1 July 31.
- Competitive League (Evanston Express) fees:
  - \$145.00 to Evanston Youth Soccer. This includes the \$37.50 required by the WY Soccer Association for insurance for your child. It also pays for coaches training and background checks, fees associated with Fall and Spring League, indoor facility use fees in the winter, equipment, club and other administrative costs. This fee is paid once a year and is good August 1 - July 31.
  - Utah Youth Soccer collects a separate registration fee to play in their fall and spring leagues. Fees are usually collected in June and January.
  - All summer and other tournaments are a separate fee. This is usually determined by the cost for the team to register divided by the number of players going to the tournament.
  - Uniforms are bought by each player. Talk to your coach if you need a uniform and he/she will let you know how to purchase the correct one.

## • Summer League recreation fees:

- \$60 to Evanston Youth Soccer. This includes \$21.00 for WY Soccer Association, coaches background checks, field maintenance fees from the Rec Center, equipment, club and other administrative costs. A reversible jersey is an additional cost of \$20 and may be reused or handed down. Red soccer socks and shorts are offered for purchase at an additional cost. Balls are purchased on your own. The \$21.00 for WY Soccer will be waived if your child participated in the Competitive League. This fee is collected during registration usually starting in March. Practices and games usually begin mid-May ending with a Saturday Round Robin.
- We register/participate in both Utah and Wyoming leagues because Utah is closer for tournament play but Wyoming offers ODP (Olympic Development Program) and state team options. You can do ODP in Utah as well (just lots more competition).
- We charge significantly less than other sports and leagues!
