Poor in spirit

Matthew 5:3 (ESV),

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

This really is a remarkable passage whereby we can ascertain a sort of mindset we should have in Christ. The poor in spirit in this case I am led to believe is not necessarily of the poor in this world who do not have earthly goods to their name.
