# 1. Enrollment & Registration Requirements

Before a child may begin, the following items must be completed and submitted:

- Completed Application Form
- Paid Application/Registration Fee
- Child Medical Examination Report
- Current Immunization Record
- Emergency Notification Card
- Signed Parent Handbook Agreement Page

**Tuition** is non-refundable. Enrollment is subject to available space and adherence to school policies. Monthly rates may be adjusted with appropriate notice.

## 2. Hours of Operation & Closures

**Operating Hours:** Monday–Friday, 7:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m.

**Drop-Off Window:** 7:30 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. (after 9:30 a.m. requires a doctor's note)

Late Pick-Up Fee: \$3.00 per minute after 5:30 p.m.

#### **Scheduled Closures:**

- New Year's Eve and Day
- Spring Break
- Good Friday
- Memorial Day
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving Day and Friday After
- Christmas Eve and Day
- 7–14 days after Christmas (Winter Break)

Note: TCA reserves the right to close due to inclement weather or emergencies.

### 3. Arrival & Departure Procedures

- Please dress your child appropriately for the weather and pack all daily supplies.
- No outside food, candy, or gum is permitted at drop-off.
- Goodbyes should be brief to ensure a smooth transition.
- Only authorized individuals with written documentation and ID may pick up a child.
- Legal documentation must be on file for custody-related pick-up restrictions.

# 4. Communication & Daily Reports

We use Brightwheel, a secure digital platform, to:

- Share daily activities, photos, and updates
- Send real-time notifications for diaper changes, meals, milestones, and more
- Provide secure messaging between parents and teachers
- Record attendance and incident reports

Brightwheel ensures consistent communication between home and school, promoting transparency and involvement in your child's day.

# 5. Curriculum and Developmental Goals

Our curriculum aligns with the Missouri Early Learning Standards (MoELS) in these domains:

- Social & Emotional Development
- Language & Communication
- Approaches to Learning

- Physical Development
- Cognitive Skills (Math, Science, Creative Arts)

We provide **age-appropriate instruction** through thematic monthly units and integrated learning activities:

- Circle time, storytelling, music, movement, and dramatic play
- Foundational literacy and numeracy concepts
- Sensory activities, fine/gross motor skill development
- Science discovery, weather observation, and nature walks

Instructional times are structured but flexible, supporting each child's growth and readiness for kindergarten.

# 6. Positive Guidance & Behavior Support

We promote respectful behavior, cooperation, and kindness through:

- Positive reinforcement
- Redirection
- Clear expectations and age-appropriate consequences

### **Discipline Policy by Age:**

- 6 months-24 months: Gentle verbal correction, positive reinforcement
- 2–3 years: Two verbal warnings followed by time-out (1 minute per year of age)

#### **Severe Behavior:**

• Biting or physical aggression results in:

1st Offense: Parent notification

o 2nd Offense: Parent observation

o 3rd Offense: Student will stay home until behavior has been modified

If behavior disrupts learning or compromises safety despite following discipline protocols, parents will be contacted.

# 7. Daily Routine (Sample Schedule)

Activities may vary by class, season, and age group.

Time	Activity	
7:30–8:30	Arrival, free play, story time	
8:30–9:30	Morning snack, diapering/toileting	
9:30–10:30	Instructional time	
10:30–11:00	Music/PE/Enrichment	
11:00–11:30	Lunch	
11:30-Noon	Diapering/toileting, clean up	
12:00–2:30	Rest/quiet time	
2:30–3:00	Snack and hygiene routines	
3:00–4:30	Structured play, video learning	
4:30–5:30	Outdoor play (weather permitting), pickups	

# 8. Diapering & Potty Training Policy

- Parents provide all diapering supplies.
- Diapers are changed every 3 hours or as needed.

• Diapering surfaces and hands are sanitized after each change.

#### **Potty Training:**

We will support training once your child has shown at least 2 weeks of success at home in pull-ups. Collaboration between families and teachers is essential.

# 9. Health & Safety Procedures

#### Illness Policy:

Sick children must remain home. Please notify the school of any absence due to illness.

#### **Emergency Medical Plan:**

- 1. Call 911 (if applicable)
- 2. Notify parent/emergency contact
- 3. Separate child and administer appropriate care
- 4. Transport child and health forms to the nearest facility

#### Cleanliness & Handwashing:

Staff and children follow strict hygiene routines including washing hands before meals, after toileting, and after outdoor or messy play.

# 10. Supplies Checklist

#### Parents should provide:

- Diapers/pull-ups, wipes, creams
- Weather-appropriate clothing & change of clothes
- Velcro or closed-toe shoes (no flip-flops)
- Pacifier (if used)
- Labeled backpack and personal items
- Sunscreen (applied at home)

### 11. Absences & Emergency Contact Updates

Please report absences promptly. Keep emergency contact and health information current. Parents bear all costs related to emergency medical treatment.

### 12. Child Abuse Reporting

We are **mandated reporters** under Missouri law. Staff are required to report suspected abuse or neglect. Children may be interviewed by authorities without parental consent.

### 13. Family Involvement & Communication

We welcome parent-teacher communication and feedback. Conferences may be scheduled as needed, and Brightwheel provides an open channel for regular updates and concerns.

If you have a question or need clarification, please don't hesitate to reach out to us. Our goal is to provide a safe, nurturing environment for every child to flourish.

# 14. Brightwheel Parent Guide

Brightwheel is our secure parent communication and management app. It allows families and staff to stay connected in real time.

#### Features include:

- Daily updates with photos, videos, and activity logs
- Real-time alerts for meals, naps, diapering, and more
- Digital check-in and check-out with electronic signature
- Secure messaging between parents and staff
- Access to developmental progress and classroom notes
- Attendance and billing management (if applicable)

#### **Getting Started:**

- 1. Download the Brightwheel app from the App Store or Google Play
- 2. Accept the invitation from Trinity Christian Academy
- 3. Turn on notifications for real-time updates
- 4. Use the messaging feature to stay in close contact with teachers

We strongly encourage all families to use Brightwheel consistently to stay informed and engaged in your child's daily experiences.

#### 15. Missouri Milestones Overview

Our program aligns with the **Missouri Early Learning Standards (MoELS)** to ensure age-appropriate development and readiness for kindergarten.

#### **Key Developmental Areas:**

#### 1. Social & Emotional Development

- Shows increasing independence
- Engages in cooperative play
- Manages emotions with adult guidance

#### 2. Language & Communication

- Expands vocabulary
- Uses sentences to express ideas
- Listens and responds in conversations

#### 3. Cognitive Development

- Understands cause and effect
- Begins recognizing patterns and numbers
- Explores and solves problems through play

#### 4. Physical Development

- Demonstrates coordination and balance
- Uses fine motor skills (cutting, buttoning, coloring)
- Practices personal care and hygiene

Teachers use these standards to guide classroom activities, set individualized goals, and track progress.

# Infants (0-12 months)

#### Social & Emotional

- Smiles at caregivers, shows joy by 2–3 months
- Reacts to voices, displays stranger anxiety by ~6 months

#### **Language & Communication**

- Coos and babbles by 2–4 months
- Responds to name, says "mama/dada" by ~9–12 months

#### **Physical Development**

- Holds head up by 3 months
- Rolls over by 5–6 months; crawls, pulls to stand by 9–10 months

#### Cognitive (Thinking) Skills

- Watches faces, tracks moving objects
- Explores by reaching; explores toys by 6–9 months

# Toddlers (1-2 years)

#### **Social & Emotional**

- Uses simple routines; shows independence like saying "no"
- Engages in parallel play

#### **Language & Communication**

- Strings words into 2–3 word sentences by 2 years
- Gradually increases vocabulary

#### **Physical Development**

- Walks well, can run, climbs stairs with help by 18 months
- Builds 6-block towers; kicks ball by 2 years

### **Cognitive Skills**

- Engages in pretend play (e.g., feeding doll)
- Identifies familiar objects or pictures

# Preschoolers (2-3 years)

#### Social & Emotional

Begins cooperative play; expresses a range of emotions

### **Language & Communication**

- Speaks in multi-word sentences; clearly understood by familiar adults
- Follows 2-step directions

#### **Physical Development**

• Jumps with both feet; fine motor control like drawing lines or circles

Rides tricycle by about 3 years old

#### **Cognitive Skills**

- Sorts objects by shape/color, starts asking "why"
- Engages in simple pretend play or problem-solving

# Pre-Kindergarten (3-4 years)

#### **Social & Emotional**

- Plays cooperatively and shares; forms friendships
- Recognizes own emotions, still needs help managing big feelings

#### **Language & Communication**

- Speaks in full sentences, asks questions, and tells stories
- Understands multi-step instructions and basic concepts like "under" or "next to"

#### **Physical Development**

- Hops, balances on one foot; draws simple shapes; uses scissors
- Throws and kicks a ball, pedals a tricycle confidently

#### **Cognitive Skills**

- Recognizes colors, shapes, numbers (1–10); counts objects
- Retells parts of a story; engages in imaginative play

#### **How You Can Support at Home**

- Talk and sing—describe daily routines to build vocabulary.
- Play together—pretend play, puzzles, and drawing encourage thinking.
- Read daily—ask questions like "What happens next?"

• Stay active—outdoor play builds coordination and confidence.
