A MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT


Last Sunday it was my turn in the hospital. Initial scans indicated a total blockage of my intestine perhaps caused by a bug, bacterial infection, or minor shock to the abdomen. The following day the doctors told me that I'd most likely need surgery with about a week recovery in the hospital.

The first day was a bit rough and the word got out of my predicament. The Ladies Auxiliary and Knights put me on their respective prayer lists, and I settled into my plight. Now, I am a believer and I do pray daily but it's mostly in thanksgiving to God for yet one more wonderful day. I always felt that only praying to God when you need something was not a way to endear you to Him.

I also had this little nagging doubt that my need wouldn't be important enough or worth His time. (I can almost imagine an abrasive chuckling little devil in the back of my mind with a pitchfork prodding that doubt.) The prayers did work when my wife Connie was in the hospital and almost the same day. But for me, I sort of had that Ronald Reagan attitude "Trust but verify."

The following morning, I actually felt a lot better. After seeing the doctor, they rolled me down to the imaging floor and low and behold, no more blockage. The next day they let me go home and on Friday night I was eating fish at the Fish Fry.

I still have that cautious tiny little doubt but significantly less so. In short, I wouldn't want to risk rolling those dice again without your prayers.


