MESSAGE FROM YOUR GRAND KNIGHT

The First Commandment and the Modern-Day Golden Calf

At our last business meeting, I had some fun showing progressively outlandish pictures of Pumpkin Patch promotions. The photos went from a Patch at Bikefest, to pumpkins with a Daytona race pit crew, to the Miami Monkey Jungle, to pumpkins in a Venice Gondola and ending with two Astronauts holding pumpkins on the moon. It was interesting watching the audience viewing the photo-realistic images with growing incredulity as the photos got more outlandish.



This was my first personal experience using an Artificial Intelligence (AI) system. It was fun and disturbingly easy. The photos

were not modifications of existing photos but entirely generated from the "mind" of the AI (Microsoft DALL-E). Each photo took 7 seconds to create. Other AI systems like ChatGPT can write a full term paper or thesis in 20 seconds. This of course is causing great consternation among university professors.

But that's the light side of Al. Standby as new Al systems are able to take a photo of a person and generate a flawless video of that person saying and doing anything. Imagine the chaos that will be caused seeing videos of politicians and even clergy saying and doing whatever. Imagine the mental confusion that will be caused in young people who are already confused about their goals, ethics, and identity. Closer to home, imagine getting a Facebook video from someone who looks and sounds exactly like your granddaughter in a panic asking for ransom money or bail.

The Al revolution promises to do great and wonderful work but also has the potential of great harm. Additionally, never in my wildest dreams did I think that we would step into the realm of God's First Commandment. In a recent "Word on Fire" article ¹, one of Bishop Baron's colleagues, Justin Kalan cited action by a Microsoft executive who filed paperwork for a nonprofit religious organization called "The Way of the Future²." Its mission: "To develop and promote the realization of a Godhead based on artificial intelligence and through understanding and worship of the Godhead contribute to the betterment of society."

I'll let you form your own opinion where that will lead.

What can we do at our level? Not much, that genie is exiting the bottle. We will have to be vigilant and very skeptical of anything we see or hear in the media that just doesn't look or sound right. Have a family "Password" that is only shared in person and not by email. Peace be with you! My +Dad served in WWII, like many of yours; and quite possibly including a couple of you. He didn't like to talk about it too much, but once in a while he would open up. One of those times, like most of his stories, he was teaching a lesson; because of our youth, we sometimes didn't realize it. He began as an infantryman, later joining the Army Air Corps as a waist-gunner on a B-24 Liberator. In those early days, he was on a troop transport truck when they were strafed by a Japanese fighter. Brothers in arms were jumping from the truck to escape; whether it was fear or divine providence, he couldn't move, so he began praying to the Blessed Mother for Her Help. +Dad said it was like Moses parting the Red Sea, he saw the rounds/tracers split and go around him. Afterward he found others that had jumped free or under the truck had been hit. +Pop's devotion to Our Blessed Mother exponentially grew that day. 
