

Member Spotlight Mike Saputo

Our Member Spotlight this month features Mike Saputo, a creative, self-made man with a special affection for a 1966 Electra convertible.

Mike was raised in south St. Louis and graduated from Bishop Dubourg High School. He attended St Louis Community College Meramec Campus and received an Associate degree in Commercial Art.

His first interest in cars developed from a brand identification game he and his brother played when making the long trek in a 1961 Chevy Nomad station wagon north to Jennings to see his grandma. They would position themselves in the rear facing back seat and name the models that zoomed by them.

His first car, the beast as Mike refers to it, was a 1956 Ford Fairlane, and also a blast to drive. It was tricked out with functional hood scoop, and fender skirts cut out to allow for bigger racing tires, powered by a 292c.i. Y block engine. Having a mechanic for a friend whose brother-in-law was even more well versed in engine modification, Mike had them help him transplant a 390 c.i. engine from a '67 Ford station wagon into his Fairlane. He had many a wild ride with this car until he retired it to move on to other Fords.



For a time, Mike owned a very cool a '66 T Bird with landau top. He was attracted to the bells and whistles of the lux interior and of course the sequential rear signal lights. Later he drove a 1969 Ford Galaxie XL convertible, a mean machine with an intimidating front grille. He was from then on forever smitten with the convertible body style.

Upon perusing the newspaper's classified car ads one day, a favorite pastime of any car nut, he came upon an ad for a 1966 Electra convertible for sale. Mike was immediately drawn to this Buick convertible's style and captivated by its road manners. He remembered driving his dad's '59 Le Sabre as a young'un and the solid ride of that car. So, this

'66 Electra became his comrade. It stayed by his side for twenty-two years accompanying him on many a ride in the country to contemplate night skies and surrounding moonlit rural land-scapes.

Mike has been a self-employed gardener and landscaper most of his life driving a long running road warrior, a 1992 Toyota Previa to haul his equipment. But he also has a very artistic side and has enjoyed much success selling his paintings, portraits and being contracted out for wall murals. He even had stints with a sports shop, carving miniature mascots for teams in wood that were then pressed into a mold to make a trophy.

Mike's other pastime is music. He teaches banjo lessons and has his own band, the eclectic Bony Goats. The Bony Goats have even played at the Sheldon. And for our club picnics, he always supplies the entertainment of his old timey acoustic mountain music.

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When cruising through the Horseless Carriage Club's Forest Park Easter show one year, Mike met John Pegg and Jeff Watkins who introduced him to the Gateway Chapter Buick Club. He has faithfully stayed with us even after the departure of the '66 Electra. After 22 years, time finally took its' toll on the car and Mike did not have quite the enthusiasm to undertake the full restoration project that it would require. So today Mike enjoys our club events, is still loyal to all Buicks and is a pleasure to see at many club gatherings.

Editor Coments:

The car that Mike owned is the same model car that Jayne Mansfield was riding in when she was killed. The following article describes the accident:

Blonde bombshell actress Jayne Mansfield is killed instantly on June 29, 1967 when the car in which she is riding strikes the rear of a trailer truck on U.S. Route 90 east of <u>New Orleans</u>, <u>Louisiana</u>.

Mansfield had been on her way to New Orleans from Biloxi, <u>Mississippi</u>, where she had been performing a standing engagement at a local nightclub; she had a television appearance scheduled the following day. Ronald B. Harrison, a driver for the Gus Stevens Dinner Club, was driving Mansfield and her lawyer and companion, Samuel S. Brody, along with three of Mansfield's children with her ex-husband Mickey Hargitay, in Stevens' 1966 Buick Electra. On a dark stretch of road, just as the truck was approaching a machine emitting a thick white fog used to spray mosquitoes (which may have obscured it from Harrison's view), the Electra hit the trailer-truck from behind. Mansfield, Harrison and Brody were all killed in the accident. Eight-year-old Mickey, six-year-old Zoltan and three-year-old Marie, or Mariska, had apparently been sleeping on the rear seat; they were injured but survived.

In the aftermath of this accident, government regulations required the use of structure on the rear of a trailer to prevent cars going under the bed of a trailer in a similar accident. These bars are commonly referred to as "Mansfield Bars".



Liars, Cheats and Scoundrels

Something about lying and cheating seems to be in our DNA as humans. It is so prevalent in our world now and throughout all time. This is at the forefront of the news currently in the wake of the sign stealing scandal involving the Houston Astros. Drawn into this web is also the Boston Red Sox and now our own Tony LaRussa has been accused of committing dastardly activities in his days with the Chicago White Sox.

Well, it is a good thing that we can immerse ourselves in the car world where cheating is totally non-existent! Yea, I didn't think I could fool you with that one. Actually, cars, specifically car racing, seems to set the standard for either clever or blatant means of cheating.

Lets start with the beginning of how car racing began. A couple of reasons stand out. Competition and winning seems to be part of who we are. Think of the Roman chariot races as depicted in the movie Ben Hur. There was a strong desire to win the race and a vicious means of obtaining a competitive advantage was employed to assure victory. Racing just seems to be who we are. I heard a guy making a presentation on tractor pulling and he was asked when was the first tractor pull competition. He replied "probably the day the second tractor was produced".

Another very practical reason to race cars is to promote the product and convince the buying public to purchase the model car that is successful on the race track. "Win on Sunday, Sell on Monday" As a side benefit of competitive car racing is the development to technologies to be applied to passenger vehicles. The most simplistic of these developments was the rear view mirror developed for the Indianapolis 500 race cars.

In the world of car racing and cheating, the name Smokey Yunick rises to the top of the heap. Smokey was an uneducated guy from Florida who was probably the sharpest mind in the history of engines and car racing. He did have a dark side about him in that he always considered a rule as something not necessarily to be adhered to but rather a challenge to circumvent. Two of Smokey's more notable examples can now be told.

Back in the middle 60's, he built a Chevelle that was a 7/8 scale model car. Since NAS-CAR was trusting that competitors were running cars that were essentially "stock" there was no means to check the body dimensions for compliance. The smaller car had an aero-dynamic advantage since the frontal area was less, thus the power to push it through the air was less. Supposedly, this was not discovered until long after the race when the car was sitting next to new model Chevelle in the parking lot. Another of his escapades was

building an engine that rotated in the opposite direction, The torque reaction from applying power coming out of the corner was towards the inside of the curve rather than outside, thus this car handled much better coming out the corner. Similar Smokey stories abound and have been written in numerous books and magazine articles.

Well, you say, that could never happen with any Buick car as it would be mirch the good reputation of the Buick legacy. Actually, one of the more outrageous stories of cheating did come out of the Buick history book. I was very fortunate to have been able to hear the late Buick historian, Terry Dunham, make a presentation at the 2003 Buick Centennial Nationals in Flint, Michigan. The title of his presentation was "The Buick Race Cars from Hell." It was a wonderful presentation from this very interesting man who we lost way too early.

The time was 1908, in the very early years of the American automobile industry. Though Dave Dunbar Buick was the founder of the Buick Motor Company, it was really the work of his Chief Engineer, Walter Marr, that set Buick apart from others in the fledgling auto industry. Walter was not granted a patent on the overhead valve engine (OHV), but he was by all intents and purposes the first to recognize the inherent breathing capability of this design and apply it to production cars. Buick remains the only US auto manufacturer which has never produced an "L head" AKA "flathead" engine in a production car. In order to show off the advantages of the OHV engine, he recognized that competing in auto races would be the best way to showcase this design.

Starting in 1908, there were Buicks entered in various races around the country. Though operating on a shoestring, the successes were pretty impressive. He knew that the Savannah Grand Prize race was coming up which would draw cars from both the US and Europe. He built a total of 4 cars for this race. There were two each based on the Model 10 and the Model 16 production cars. He bought a railroad box car and fitted it with a small machine shop and blacksmith facility to support the racing endeavor. The railcar also served the purpose of "command central" for the Buick team.


Though the cars appeared to be well set for the race, each car went out early in the race due to rear axle and suspension issues. Thus, the goal of winning the race and showing off the Buick did not come to pass, There was, however, a unique opportunity that presented itself that may not have been within the spirit of competition.

The German Benz cars were clearly the class of the field and swept most of the accolades. However, one of the Benz cars flipped over in a turn and was not able to complete the race. In those early days of racing, removing a disabled car from the racing surface was the responsibility of the team, which usually occurred either after the completion of the race or the next day. Fortuitously, the accident occurred right near where the Buick command post was located. The Buick team rushed to the scene of the wreck, ostensibly the

assist in the cleanup, but in actuality it was to inspect the car to see what the Germans had figured out in the suspension system that the Buick boys had not. Further to that, the Buick team came back later that night and, illuminated by lanterns, partially disassembled the car and thoroughly measured and documented the Benz suspension system. Since the Benz team was going to wait until daylight to remove the car from its resting spot, the Buick team was able to take their time to complete their nefarious but of espionage.


Upon their return to Flint, the knowledge obtained from the Benz was built into the stable of race cars for the upcoming year. Their efforts paid off handsomely as Buicks dominated the racing scene for the next 3 years and established Buick as car capable of competing against all others.

Well, so much for honor and integrity!


