

Member Input

Ed Note: By the time you read this issue, I will have had my knee replacement surgery. The date of the surgery was scheduled close to the time of the month when I put the Gazette together and I was fearful that my recovery would inhibit my ability to complete a full and quality issue. I solicited articles from members to take some of the burden off me and provide interesting comings and goings for the whole club to enjoy. Herewith are some of the inputs I have received.

Robert Vogt:

I worked at McMackin Buick in Collinsville II., my first job after graduating from Rankin Technical College in 64 where I purchased a 69 Buick Electra my first Buick. Awesome car that I kept for over seven years. I worked at McMackin from 64 to 75 as a line technician and the only person to work on Opels they were nice little cars. After leaving McMackin I went to work at Elder Cadillac in Belleville IL; first as a technician and finally taking over as service writer in 86 and was there till we closed in 97. I have been retired since then. I have had six Buick's including my 66 Buick Le Sabre and 99 Regal at present along with a 67 Special, my 69 Electra, 93 Buick Estate Wagon. I have attended Hot Rod Power Tour three times doing the long haul. Once coming home from Kansas City, I felt asleep behind the wheel and hit the center median destroying the entire left side of my car. The following winter I spent the year repairing it with new left fender, front door, back door, and a complete quarter panel that was removed at the factory seam and replace along with a new rear bumper. When I purchased the 66 I had to rebuild the windshield frame as it was completely rusted out, bottom of both front fender and right quarter that had the drain installed incorrect when it was built, I also ordered a new hood since the front had been crunched, but they sent me an Electra hood that is 3 inches longer that the LeSabre one, Electra's have four port holes in the fenders LeSabres three making the longer fenders and hoods. I have a neighbor who builds cars for people who took the hood and cut the 3 inches out of the back and welded it back together it is perfect now. He does beautiful work, now building a 37 Ford Sedan for himself and a 56 Ford half ton that he is completely restoring and putting a big block Chevy engine in it and automatic.

I have a son who has a 67 Chevy short bed pickup who when he purchased it was a rust bucket, I spent 5 months repairing it, painted, it has a 350 cubic inch engine, 5 speed transmission that we had to pull out once to replace the clutch, and another time to repair it when we lost 5th gear. It is on air bags, quite a ride, love it. I also have a 79 El Camino that I am doing body mods on, like I put a roll pan on the back, frenched my own taillight in the rear of the quarter panel and have fiberglass front bumper that I am going to mold in the front fenders like the rear roll pan. removing drip rails, eliminating the quarter windows and other modifications I will, if

possible, go on the Power Tour this year attend car shows in my area, attend meeting if possible and go drive my 66 when I can wherever, it has the original drive train in it and only around 48,000 original miles, I am the third owner, last guy only put 5,000 miles on it in ten years. Love driving it when weather is nice but otherwise it sit in my garage with a cover on it as does all my vehicles.

Gary Blakemore:

Late News: The "263" Buick Eight came to life late yesterday and spoke with "Authority"!!!! 40 PSI Oil Pressure and 5 PSI Fuel Pressure, right on the numbers. Dual Carbs performed well with straight linkage. Broke-in the engine and put it to rest for the day. Very Happy. Next; is to complete wiring, then final fit on all panels, primer and off to the paint shop.

Jeff Johnson:

Nan and I took an out of town road trip to Ohio a while back. Feeling confident in my 1951 Buick Roadmaster, that was the mode of transportation selected. All was well until the drive home. For reasons I have not been able to determine, my charging system decided to malfunction. The car has the 6 volt electrical system, which, apparently, is prone to be troublesome. As long as the engine was up to speed, all went well, but the car would die if I let the engine run at idle speed. Gas stops were exciting as I had to impose on other travelers to give me a "jump" to get the car running again. Returning to the highway was also an adventure as I was afraid to let the engine slow down so many a red light was violated. We were able to limp home in this mode and put the car away for later diagnosis and repair.

I am considering a 12 volt conversion. It might pose more questions than answers but maybe someone out there will have a thought. I have looked at a few websites for conversion articles and I have a list of electrical experts to consult. Feel free to add your 2 cents worth to my dilemma if you have knowledge in this area.

Gary Heim:

I grew up with cars! 1n 1947 my parents opened a Kaiser-Frazer dealership in Vandalia, Missouri. I was 4 years old. I thought Henry J was a neat name for a car.

In 1952 when I was eight years old, when Kaiser-Frazer flamed out, my parents opened a Buick dealership in a different and nicer location. Vandalia had a population of a little over 3000 and six new car dealerships. There are no dealerships there today.

My best friend was killed on a small Harley motorcycle when he was 13. I was 11 years old then and into my second Cushman motor scooter, an Eagle.

My father decided it was time to get me off two wheels and into four wheels. I traded my Cushman Eagle for a 1947 Chevrolet convertible. I gave it a super cleaning, did maintenance and minor repairs, and found a buyer. We lived seven miles south of town, so I actually drove it quite a bit. I was 12. Eventually I sold the '47 and bought a 1949 Chevrolet 2 door fast back and then a Ford Custom with overdrive.

Then I hit the jackpot! I traded the '53 Ford and \$300 for a 1953 Jaguar XK120 fixed head coupe. I was 14.

I sold the Jag and had enough money to buy a 1957 Desoto convertible. I wish I had that one back. I moved the Desoto on in a short period of time and bought a used 1958 Buick Special convertible.





By that time, I was old enough to work and make some extra money. I traded the '58 for a new 1959 Invicta Buick. I was 15.

By the end of 1958, Dad had added American Motors, but had a major heart attack at the age of 45. Things were falling apart pretty fast. They locked the doors on the dealership in 1960.

After I turned 16, I traded the '59 for a 1960 Metropolitan convertible. From the Metro, I bought a 1959 Chevrolet Impala convertible, and then a 1959 Corvette. I sold the Corvette in June of 1962 to spend 2 years in the Navy. I was 18 years old.

"On Easter Sunday, 2004, I attended the HCCM Concours d'elegance Car Show at the Upper Muny parking lot in Forest Park. Being a Gateway Buick Club member, I rode in with the group of Buicks to the display area of the lot around 8:30am. I had sold my '67 Electra 225 Convertible in 1998 and my other Buick, a '62 Skylark 2dr Hardtop, needs a lot of work to be roadworthy.

After viewing all the cars on the show field, two brothers stopped to look at the group of Buicks parked together. They came up to me and inquired if anyone in our club would be interested in a '68 Electra 225 4dr Hardtop. I responded yes and that I was very interested. It was their father's car and was located in Brussels, Illinois, where they both lived. I obtained their contact information and made arrangements to see the car a week later.

Their father had bought it new and was all original, never being repainted. Vinyl top and upholstery were in really good condition. I decided to purchase it and gave them a deposit to hold the car. About a month later, a friend drove me back to make final payment and I then drove the car home. Only problem I noticed was a hesitation upon acceleration from a stop, so I then took it to a friend's repair shop. It was decided that the accelerator pump in the carburetor was bad, so a rebuild was necessary.

After a further inspection of all engine and drivetrain components, no other problems were found, and engine ran fine. Transmission shifted normally so I took it out for a 30 mile drive. I then decided to drive it to the 2004 BCA National Meet in Plano, Texas, in June. The Electra drove great, and no mechanical problems were encountered during the entire trip.

Kustom Korner

"After building numerous Fords and Chevys, I wanted to have something different from the mainstream," says Fred DeFalco. He got just that with this ultra-cool, custom-crafted 1954 Buick Century known as "Jaded."

Built by <u>Church Rods and Relics</u> in Michigan, the Buick sports a new custom frame that incorporates a <u>Fatman IFS</u>, <u>RideTech</u> air springs, <u>Wilwood</u> disc brakes, and one-off 19- and 20-inch <u>EVOD</u> wheels. The 383c.i. stroker small-block Chevy engine is fed by Inglese induction and dressed up like a Nailhead using custom <u>Curtis</u> Speed valve covers. It's backed by a 700R4 transmission.

A long list of subtle refinements updates the big Buick body, including a narrowed and tucked front bumper, custom-machined headlight trim, a filled cowl, extended rear fins, tucked and lowered rear bumper, one-off inner fenders and firewall, and custom fit and finish on all of the body panels. It's all beautifully covered in <u>Glasurit</u> two-tone green paint. A custom dash by Matt Brady leads the way inside, with <u>Classic Instruments</u> fitted into custom bezels by Curtis Speed. Don's Custom Auto Upholstery stitched custom-dyed green leather over Lexus seats, while a custom wheel from <u>Jesse Greening</u> tops the <u>Flaming River</u> column.

There is no penalty for safety equipment, however, there will be a 2 point deduction for not having a fire extinguisher.

Historic classes (restored vehicles) are judged to the above standard (as original from a dealer (factory) based on authenticity and condition.
