Member Spotlight

Pete Nathan

Pete Nathan, is not only a long time Buick enthusiast , and chief financial officer of the club, but also a master at modifications on his award winning 1935 57 Series sedan.

Pete's parents were of German descent and immigrated to England during World War II. Born in London during the days of war torn Europe, Pete spent a tumultuous childhood there for his first ten years. He remembers standing in lines for food stamps and experiencing the destruc-



tion of Nazi air raids. Then, after the war, his family made their way to the US with aspirations of a better life and better air quality for Pete's asthma.

The Nathan family settled in St. Louis under the sponsorship of his uncle. Pete attended and graduated from Cleveland High School. As a young man, he really had no interest in cars of any kind; only to get from Point A to Point B. Afterward, he joined the Air Force for a four year stint. First serving as an emergency room medic stateside, he then went on to Viet Nam and flew on air evacuations from the war zone.

As his time in service ended, Pete met his future wife for the next 51 years, Wendy, on a blind date. After their marriage, he enrolled in University of Missouri -St. Louis on the GI Bill and graduated with a degree in Sociology. He spent a career of 30 plus years in industrial packaging sales for the St. Louis Paper and Box Co.

One day in 1989, Pete's mindset changed and he bought a luxury land yacht—the 1972 Cadillac Eldorado convertible. Some friends talked him into entering it into a car show. Pete, having no clue about car club events, won a 2nd place trophy with his Eldo. After attending more shows, and connecting with this car nut crowd, Pete came to the conclusion that the camaraderie was totally enjoyable. People who he met were down to earth and he took great pleasure in observing the fun they had showing their classic vehicles. He adds that the cars are really secondary to an event. It is the common interests shared that it most important. Therefore, Pete's focus on automobiles of a vintage status ramped up in the '90's. He added a 1968 Oldsmobile Cutlass to his fledgling collection which he also showed for several years. Then, a man from Holland made him an offer on the Cadillac and it went back across the pond to new roadways.

In the year 2000, with his three daughters out of college and on their own, Pete decided it was time to treat himself to a car he really wanted. He began searching the Internet for a 1935 Buick and shopped for six months until he found it in Texas. Pete assessed its condition as junk with a rare transplanted 340 Buick engine, but it was drivable. The trek back home stalled in Arkansas when transmission shifts disappeared at 1:30 in the morning. Upon calling AAA, and asking for roadside assist for a 1935 Buick, he was first treated as a crank caller. Finally, the truck appeared with enough transmission fluid for Pete to add every 50 miles to finish the trip home.

The '35 spent three years in restoration shops. Today, it appears to be a vintage sedan of the day with a rather interesting form of the female figure as a hood ornament. But underneath, it is a mean machine with new disc brakes, power steering, radiator, modified rear end and transmission mated to the rebuilt 340 Buick engine. Kudos go to Greg's Auto Repair for performing first class maintenance and custom upgrades on Pete's Buick in recent years.

Once when Pete attended a Buick show at St. Clair Square when the '35 was still unfinished, he was given the brush off by an unnamed club member upon mentioning his modifications on the car. This purist's opinion rankled Pete! But as time went on and the car was taken into a body shop in Wentzville, Pete met Paul Meyer who convinced him to join our Gateway Chapter. From there, Pete met Hank Degelman who was treasurer at that time. Hank became a great friend and mentor. He asked Pete to be Treasurer of our club. And the rest is history!





Pete enjoys driving his modified Buick on various racing courses in the Midwest to feel the power and performance of his car. He has run the tracks on Wisconsin's US131 Motor-sports Park and the Mid Ohio Sports Car Course. Pete has been a consistently dedicated worker in many club events especially the Shriners shows. He makes sure there's plentiful grub for annual oil change parties and researches purchases of necessary club items such as the Gateway Buick banner and logo shirts.

Hanging out with five grandchildren ages 5 to 13 is one of Pete's pastimes, along with taking community college courses here and there to improve his general Pete Nathan, the treasurer, is certainly a treasured member of our club.







Horseless Carriage Club of Mo. Concours d'Elegance 2019

Once again, the Horseless Carriage Club of Missouri hosted their annual Concours d'Elegance on Easter Sunday, April 20 in the Muny Parking lot at Forest Park. This show has been a regular occurrence since 1962 (57 years if you do the math).

Unlike many previous years, the day was absolutely gorgeous with temperatures in the low 80's and a sunny sky. Last year's show was so cold that the attendance was fairly low and the attendees were often huddled in masses to keep warm. Not so this year thankfully.

As in years gone by, the show was divided into 2 segments. The antique and classics were on the upper level and the modified were on the lower level. Most local clubs of a specific marque were represented in the upper level. There were showings from: Oldsmobile, Pontiac, Cadillac, Studebaker, AMC, Packard, Model T, Model A, Moon, Ford, Chevrolet, fiberglass kit cars and Military vehicles. Museum of Transportation brought their Chrysler turbine car and Mann's Restoration brought their 1930 Auburn that is a sight to behold! Notable this year was a very interesting display of antique bicycles. Yes, there were even many Buicks present!

Mechanics Corner

A very interesting site for tips on all things old cars, is the Classic Car Restoration Club. There are brief videos available free on a weekly basis and many more in depth videos on a premium basis.

This week's video shows a really good technique for creating a round and secure hole in carpeting. There are those few times when it is necessary to create a hole in a carpet. It may be due to adding seatbelts or running a wire for an accessory. It also may be necessary when installing a new carpet and creating a hole for the headlight dimmer switch. Regardless of the desired need, Mark Simpson has shown a really good tip for creating that hole.

If a hole is created by cutting through the carpet with a knife or scissors, the hole is probably not round and the edges are frayed and can continue to tear over time. Rather than cutting hole, Mark shows a way to burn the hole.

The trick is to mark the location of the desired hole and determine the diameter of the opening. Take that diameter and find a socket of the same size. Either find an old socket that is no longer of use, or head on down to the tool supply store and pick up one for a couple of bucks. Get the cheapest one available since strength is not important and the process will ruin the socket.

Put the socket on a rachet extension and heat up the outside of the socket with a propane or oxyacetylene torch until it is good and hot. Press the hot socket on the carpet much like a cattleman would brand a steer. The hot socket will melt the carpeting to the point where the center of the hole can be pushed out. The resulting hole is both round and the newly fused carpet material provides a barrier to prevent the material from tearing.

Thank you to the members who have sent in their registration forms and secured their hotel reservations. <u>Our initial block of rooms is full</u>. It took a long time to fill our initial block, and while we were waiting for it to fill so we could secure additional rooms, they were all booked. Had some problem with the second hotel recognizing we had a block of rooms. I hope that is now resolved. We are exploring the possibility of additional rooms in the area, but it is a major tourist traffic area. There is also the possibility of exploring the many bed and breakfasts in the area.

Currently we have 39 rooms booked and 22 registrations have arrived. We will release our block of rooms 7-21-2019.

It is our plan to keep you busy while you attend the regional. In addition to the activities we are offering, this is an area with many entertainment opportunities and attractions, ie:

- The Mall of America There are always new stores, restaurants and attractions opening.
