# **Member Spotlight**

## Gary Heim

This month's Gazette features Gary Heim owner of a gorgeous 1936 Buick 4 dr sedan that he practically reconstructed from the ground up. Gary took the car to the recent Back to the Bricks Cruise in Flint, Michigan where it had special reserved parking front and center because it was a Buick.



You know—you gotta start somewhere!

Gary was born in Mexico, Missouri, grew up on a farm that has been owned by his family since the late 1800's and was schooled in the Vandalia area. After high school graduation, he joined the Navy. When finished with his military stint, he returned back to his roots on the land to grow crops of soy beans and corn and maintain a small herd of cattle. Monsanto, Martha White and Quaker have been Gary's customers.

Gary's interest in cars was formed early on as his father opted to open a Buick dealership in Vandalia for a few years in the mid to late fifties. From twelve years old, Gary was around the gearhead scene working on cars. When he was sixteen, his dad hired him as a transporter to bring a new model back to town. Gary was put on a train from Montgomery City to a garage on 18<sup>th</sup> street in St. Louis to retrieve the vehicle and drive it back to the dealership.

As time went on Gary retired from farming in 1999 to relax. Then, in 2010, he started to collect project cars and possessed the skills to rebuild and restore them beginning with a 1949 Chevy two-ton truck. He went on to complete work on a 1952 MG, 1941 Chevy half

ton pickup, 1931 Chevy cabriolet with rumble seat and then the magnificent '36 Buick sedan.

Seeing an ad in Hemmings in 2016 that had no picture but listed a price of \$5000 with thousands more worth of parts to be included in the sale, Gary was intrigued. It was a three-hour drive to Davenport, Iowa to first look at this Buick. Finding it had mouse smells, and was stopped mid-restoration by the owner with the body left setting literally in pieces for eleven years, Gary passed. But upon returning home, he was struck with "buyer's remorse" shortly thereafter. He headed back with trailer in tow and drove another three hours to seal the deal. Gary says he paid \$5000 for the car but trailered home \$10,000 worth of parts, which were nicely organized, packed and labeled. As he has a complete repair shop in one of the barns for making repairs on farm equipment, Gary set to work with steadfast patience. A new engine was first on the list, so an ad for purchase was placed on Craig's List and in the Buick Bugle for a 233c.i. straight 8 engine. The ad was answered by none other than club member Al Tornabeni who wanted to change out his 36's straight 8 engine for a Nailhead. Gary then bought and sent Al's engine to Kansas City to be overhauled to original condition with crankshaft, rods and babbitt main bearings fit to perfection. He expertly put the car back together in eight months, refurbishing the undercarriage, frame and body and installing a Hampton Coach interior kit. His wife, Janet, prodded him along and referred to this project as a "Big Boy's Lego Kit"!



Gary retired from the labor intense chores of the family farm some twenty years ago and leases the land now for crop production. His hobbies include volunteering at church activities and attending Masonic Lodge gatherings. He and Janet have two children, Lynette and Luke, who both work in professional fields. Five grandchildren also expand the Heim clan.

In 2017, Gary ventured out to show his beautiful black Buick at the club's annual Shriner's Show. There, Pete and Ted put the pressure on him to join our Gateway Chapter. Though Gary lives 90 miles northwest down I70 from STL in Middleton, Missouri, he plans on get-ting together with us and helping out with 2020 Regional. We are so lucky to have him!



# How do you wash your hands? By Ted Becker

The one thing that car folks seem to have in common is getting dirty. A hard day of working on a car sure produces a lot of dirt, grit and grime on your hands. So how do you clean up afterwards? Well, I may not have all the answers or even the right answers, but I sure do have a lot of practice.

I seem to have a particular knack for getting exceedingly dirty working on cars. In many ways, I feel like Pigpen in the Peanuts cartoon strip. I can just look at a car and get dirty. In my younger days, a couple of us guys raced a late model stock car that was nearly a full time job. One time I was crawling out from under the car after changing a clutch. One of the guys looked at me laughing and said "Ted, you look like a used oil filter."

Back when I was in high school (AKA—"Young and Stupid") working on my 56 Ford, I would clean up with turpentine and Lava soap. Not recommended!! Fortunately, technology has advanced and much better cleaners are available today with much better results and easier on the skin. I thought I would share some of my experiences on the various products I use on a regular basis.

The first product is GoJo or Goop. They both make the same product that is, as far as I can tell, nearly identical. This is probably the oldest paste type cleaner on the market today. It seems to be pretty much unchanged

through the years. It comes in a carton much like a cottage cheese carton and has the same consistency as Crisco shortening. To use it, scoop out a glob and start rubbing away. It is very effective at cleaning up most forms of grime. Since this is a waterless product, it has the big drawback of an oily residue it leaves behind. Not sure if this is lanolin or some other form of oil, but it is a real problem to remove. After using Goop, you need to wash with some form of hand soap several times to get it all off. I have a carton of it, but use it very infrequently.



I belong to a rifle club and target shoot every once in a while. Bullets are covered with a wax to lubricate the bullet as it goes down the barrel and also to avoid contact with the lead in the bullet. When you load ammo into a magazine, some of the lead inevitably ends up on your fingers. They have a cherry GoJo product there which is effective in removing the lead. I use this product as well in my garage and like it very much. It has pumice (ground up lava rock) and does a nice job of getting deep down into the crevasses on the skin surface. It also leaves a little bit of the oiliness, but is very easy to clean with hand soap. I like this product.





I was at an auto parts store recently and saw a large bottle of Zep cherry cleaner. Zep is a well respected name in industrial cleaning products and many of their products are used in industrial environments. Based primarily on name reputation, I thought I'd buy a bottle of it and give it a try. It looks much like the GoJo product but is quite a bit different. It is very oily, almost as much as Goop, but it really works. I'm not sure I'll buy another bottle when this is used up, but it really does a superior job of deep cleaning.

Then there is my favorite—Fast Orange, by Permatex. This is an orange citrus oil based product. They make either with or without pumice. For pure cleaning purposes, the pumice product is much better. It comes in a pump dispenser and comes out in the consistency of plaster. It really does a nice job and the oily residue is



nearly non-existent. I usually wash my hands with soap afterwards, but sometimes this is not even necessary.



On another trip to an auto parts store I saw a sale on a Purple Power hand cleaner, so I bought it. Much like my purchase of the Zep product, I bought this on the reputation of Purple Power since they make a really good line of water based cleaners similar to Simple Green. It is similar to Fast Orange, but subtly different. Not sure if it is the grittiness or just the texture, but I find it just a short notch below Fast Orange on my preference list.

Since I talk about a final wash with hand soap, a word on which is preferable. I am not a bar soap guy, so I don't have a lot of experience here. I'm sure that old Lava soap method would work well. I

much prefer the liquid soap from a pump dispenser. There are gel type products like "Softsoap" and then there are the foam products. I have had much better experience using

the foam products. I normally give it a couple of pumps and rub it into my hands for 15 seconds or so without water. I then put my hands under the water and get the suds up and wash it all off clean. Regardless of which cleaner I use, the foaming soap normally removes all the oil after only one washing.

There are a lot of other products on the market that also have their strengths and weaknesses. I have no experience with anything other than what I have mentioned here. Perhaps some of you have other thoughts and experiences that you may want to provide as a follow up to this evaluation.

I do know that there are individual packets that can be purchased for use away from home. These are similar to wet wipes saturated with the various cleaner chemicals. I carry some in my "Emergency Repair" kit in the car, but have never used them. I have heard, however, that they are excellent to use for cleaning up oily and dirty surfaces in engine compartments and the like.

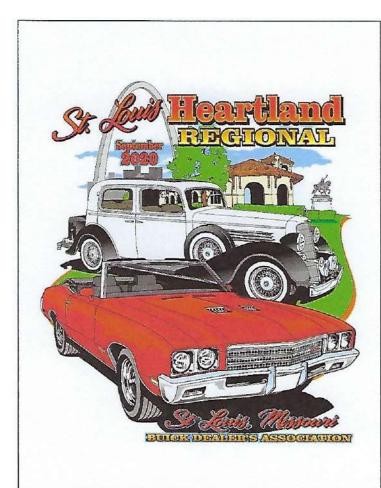
