HISTORY OF NCUSA

Precisely at 2 bells, evening watch, 18 JUNE 1938, at a Navy Veterans Reunion in Quincy, IL a new and powerful organization, The Navy Club of the United States of America (NCUSA), was launched. At that hour a Constitution and ByLaws were adopted to govern this unique group, speaking the language of those who go down to the sea in ships.

The original organization committee drew up a broad administrative charter that envisioned a new concept in collectively bringing together many private Navy Clubs and Navy Veterans Organizations that had sprung up across the country, and by so doing gave each member and prospective member a strong voice as a nationally recognized organization.

With men and women of the United States formed together in one great veterans service organization, there should come a more extensive and widespread recognition for sea-going personnel, joining together all U.S. Navy, U.S. Marines and U.S. Coast Guard men and women, to influence American thinking of the importance of first-class naval operations throughout the world to assist our National Defense.

USS ARIZONA MEMORIAL

The Navy Club dedicated the first memorial to the men who died during the attack on Pearl Harbor on Ford Island in Hawaii. When Secretary of the Navy Charles Thomas found what the Navy Club had done, he asked if the Navy Club would be interested in starting a fund-raising effort to build a large memorial to be placed over the top of the USS Arizona and dedicated to all who were killed on December 7, 1941. The Navy Club leadership at the time voted to start selling USS Arizona Shrine Project coins on a card with the coins dedicated to the USS Arizona shrine project on one side and the Preamble of the Navy Club on the other side. (See the replica displayed in this panel) This was the very first fund-raising effort to raise funds to build the current USS Arizona Memorial which is positioned over the actual USS Arizona Battleship at Pearl Harbor. All are invited to visit this unique National Memorial.



NCUSA MEMBERSHIP

Any citizen of the United States who has served, or is now serving in the United States Navy, United States Marine Corps or the United States Coast Guard (including service in an active classification in a Reserve Unit of any such Service as above) under honorable discharge, is eligible for membership in the Navy Club.
