The PMHNP will work closely with therapists and program leads to ensure coordinated care for clients experiencing anxiety, depression, trauma-related symptoms, ADHD, mood disorders, and co-occurring concerns. The ideal candidate values holistic treatment planning, transparency, and relational rapport.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct psychiatric evaluations and medication assessments
- Prescribe and manage psychotropic medications for active clients
- Provide follow-up care, medication education, and symptom monitoring
- Coordinate care with therapists and treatment team for integrated planning
- Maintain timely and thorough documentation in our EHR
