

Lavandula angustifolia
English Lavender

Seeds harvested August, 2022

Lavender benefits:

- 1) Bees love it!
- 2) Attracts pollinators/butterflies
- 3) Proven scientifically to calm
- 4) Use in sachets, as oil, or tea

Lavender needs well-drained soil, but can grow in even poor soil. Seedlings take up to 3 months to germinate.

Start indoors in cool climates and plant in the spring. Blooms 2x per season.

How to use the Seed Paper:

When ready to plant, simply cut or pinch off small pieces of the paper and plant into the soil like you would planting any other seeds.

You can also crumble the seed paper and scatter it. The pulp is compostable, organic paper that will aid in establishing the seed, so no need to separate seed from paper.

Marigolds

Seeds harvested August, 2022

Marigold benefits:

- 1) Small flower bunches, grows well in containers/gardens
- 2) Colorful: yellow, orange, maroon
- 3) Easily started from seed
- 4) Keeps unwanted pests away in gardens*
- 5) Bees love it!

Plant in spring to mid-summer.

Sow directly into garden/soil when warm in spring. Blooms in 8 weeks.

Marigolds are NOT edible!!

How to use the Seed Paper:

When ready to plant, simply cut or pinch off small pieces of the paper and plant into the soil like you would planting any other seeds.

You can also crumble the seed paper and scatter it. The pulp is compostable, organic paper that will aide in establishing the seed, so no need to separate seed from paper.
