

CASE STUDY



BACKGROUND:

Scottoiler are a Scottish based company who specialise in products aimed at the motorcycle accessories market. Their main product is an automatic motorcycle chain oiler. Diversifying into the cycle market had always been an objective for the company due to the compatibility of their lubricant to be used on bikes. This resulted in the creation of the brand Flaer

CHALLENGE:

With the recent boom in cycling and inspired by an innovation workshop held by MTBCoS, they decided to investigate reintroducing their product

SOLUTION:

The project has provided a range of support to Scottoiler including academic research through Edinburgh Napier University to test efficiency gains made when using their product; design evaluation; business to business collaboration with Morocco Media; learning journey in 2013 and showcasing UBS at EuroBike 2014-16; access to riders and elite athletes for testing and feedback.

The cycling products were rebranded as Flaer and launched in 2016 and they are now partnered with the Orica-Scott road team and Cube Gravity Action MTB teams. They continue to work with Mountain Bike Centre of Scotland to further develop their cycle product range.

FUTURE:

The Revo Terra chain performance systems have been fitted to e-bikes for future real world testing with Edinburgh Napier University and the Mountain Bike Centre of Scotland.
