

Crochet Organizer



Since I mostly work with Amigurumi, supplies shown are most of what I work with, other than stuffing and a few other things.

Finished size is approx 4 inches tall x 8 inches long x 6.5 inches wide. Of course these results will vary based on each individual's crochet style.



Materials needed to make the organizer caddy:

2 skeins of worsted weight yarn.
This pattern is done by working with 2 strands held together.

I used Red Heart Super Saver in color Aspen Print (At least 2.5 oz each, more would be better if you crochet loosely. I crochet very tight and barely had enough to sew the bottom with.)

J hook (6.00 mm)

Stitch marker

Small amount of stuffing for pin dome

Yarn needle

Pins



Special instructions:

This pattern is crocheted in the round, unless otherwise stated.

Mark the last stitch of each row with a stitch marker.

If the # is **after** the type of stitch each st goes in its own space. If the # is **before** the stitch type the sts go in the same space.

Abbreviations:

ch = chain

sc = single crochet

st = stitch

inc = increase

dec = decrease 2 sts

sl st = slip stitch

BLO = Back loops only

FLO = Front loops only

rnd(s) = round(s)

FO = sl st and cut

sc3tog = decrease 3 sts

Let's begin...

Tube #1:

1) sc 6 in magic circle (or first ch of ch 2.)

2) Inc around (12 sts)

3) *sc, inc* around (18 sts)

4) *sc 2, inc* around (24 sts)

5) *sc 3, inc* around (30 sts)

6) *sc 4, inc* around (36 sts)

7) in BLO sc around (36 sts)

8 - 21) sc around (36 sts) 14 rnds

FO, leaving a tail for sewing.

Tube #2:

1) sc 6 in magic circle (or first ch of ch 2.)

2) Inc around (12 sts)

3) *sc, inc* around (18 sts)

4) in BLO sc around (18 sts)

5 - 15) sc around (18 sts) 11 rnds

FO, leaving tail for sewing.

Tube #3:

1) sc 6 in magic circle (or first ch of ch 2.)

2) Inc around (12 sts)

3) *sc, inc* around (18 sts)

4) *sc 2, inc* around (24 sts)

5) in BLO sc around (24 sts)

6 - 12) sc around (24 sts) 7 rnds

FO, leaving a tail for sewing.

Puff



Center pin puff:

1) sc 6 in magic circle (or first ch of ch 2.)

2) Inc around (12 sts)

3) *sc, inc* around (18 sts)

4) *sc 2, inc* around (24 sts)

5 - 7) sc around (24 sts) 3 rnds

8) in BLO *sc 2, dec* around (18 sts)

9) *sc, dec* around (12 sts)

Stuff before closing

10) dec around (6 sts)

FO, leaving tail for weaving.

Weave tail through front loops of 6 sts, pull snug, weave tail.

Front tray:

Worked in the round

Ch 20

1) sc in second ch from hook, sc 7, sc3tog, sc 7, 3 sc in last ch, (now working on the bottom of the chain) sc 8, 3 sc in next st, sc 8, inc in the first ch. (40 sts) see special instructions

2) inc, sc 6, sc3tog, sc 6, inc x 3, sc 9, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, inc x 2 (46 sts)

3) in BLO sc around (46 sts) Mark the FLO st # 19.

4 - 5) sc around (46 sts) 2 rnds

FO, leaving tail for sewing.



Tray



Trim

Trim assembly:

This can be done with one strand but for extra stability I used 2 strands.

Attach yarn to first FLO of Tube #1, sc 16 sts. (16 sts)

Do your next sc in the first FLO of Tube #3, sc 12. (13 sts)

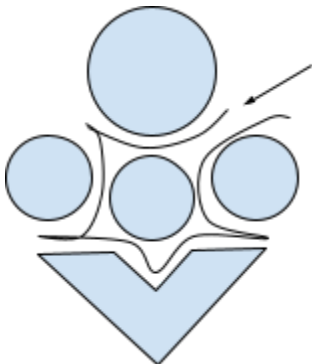
Do your next sc in the marked st of the tray piece, sc 27. (28 sts)



Do your next sc in the first FLO of Tube #2, sc 8. (9 sts)

Sl st to beginning and FO with extra long tail for sewing bases together.

Pin all the pieces together and sew in the FLO of each piece beginning with Tube #1 to Tube #2 (I hope the drawing is helpful).



With those tails from each piece, sew or tack the pieces together, weave ends and fill it up with all your supplies!

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Tadda, you're done! I hope you enjoyed making my Crochet Organizer.
