Who Is the Deliverer?

Some came oppressed by unclean spirits.

Others came trapped in sin, fear, or hopelessness.

Understand, Jesus never looked at a person as a problem to solve.

He saw men, women, and children created in the image of God—people the Father loved and had come to rescue.

Again and again, He revealed His authority.

He forgave sins.

He healed the sick.

He restored the broken.

He cast out unclean spirits.

He proclaimed the kingdom of God.

Every miracle pointed to one glorious truth: **Jesus Christ is Lord.**

Don't miss this.

The power was never the message. Jesus Christ was.



What Is Jesus Teaching You?

Maybe you have come with questions.

You may wonder whether freedom is possible for you.

You may carry wounds that seem too deep.

You may have prayed for years without seeing the breakthrough you long for.

Wherever you find yourself today, begin here. Lift your eyes to Jesus Christ.

He is not overwhelmed by your past.

He is not intimidated by your present.

He already knows your story, and He invites you to come to Him.

The greatest miracle is not simply that Jesus has authority over darkness.

The greatest miracle is that He lovingly calls sinners to Himself, forgives them, makes them His own, and transforms them by His grace.

Freedom begins with a relationship with the Deliverer.

A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that your freedom depends on finding the right minister, the right prayer, or the right method. Or maybe you've begun to believe that your situation is too difficult for God to change.

However, listen to the words of Scripture.

Your hope has never rested in a method.

Your hope rests in a Person.

Jesus Christ has not changed.

He is still the Savior.

He is still the Shepherd.

He is still the Deliverer.

He is still able to save completely those who come to God through Him.

What Difference Does This Make?

When you begin with Jesus instead of your struggle, everything changes.

Fear begins to give way to hope.

Confusion begins to give way to truth.

Despair begins to give way to faith.

Your eyes are no longer fixed upon the size of your battle.

They are fixed upon the greatness of your Savior.

Understand, that is where true freedom begins.



As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, you will discover that freedom is not merely about being released from something. It is about being brought into a deeper relationship with Someone.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

Before you ask, **"How can I find freedom?"**

Ask, **"Jesus, help me know You more."**

Spend time in His Word.

Speak with Him in prayer.

Bring your fears honestly before Him.

Trust what He has promised.

Whether your journey is just beginning or you have walked with Him for many years, the invitation remains the same.

Remain close to Jesus.

The closer you know the Deliverer, the more confidently you will trust Him with every area of your life.

A Prayer

Father, thank You for sending Your Son into the world to seek and save the lost.

Thank You that Jesus Christ is mighty to save, faithful to forgive, and powerful to set people free. Help me fix my eyes upon Him instead of my fears.

Teach me to trust Him more deeply each day.

Lead me by Your Holy Spirit into the truth of Your Word, and shape my life into the likeness of Christ. May I never seek freedom apart from the One who is Himself my freedom.

An Invitation

Before you continue reading about biblical deliverance, pause for a few quiet moments with the Lord.

Read the Gospel accounts of Jesus.

Notice how He treats people.

Notice His compassion.
