A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that only pastors, missionaries, or gifted teachers are sent by Christ. Or maybe you've thought you must know far more before Jesus can use you. But remember who His first disciples were. Ordinary people. People who had learned to walk with Him.

Now, don't miss this. Jesus has never looked for perfect people. He delights in hearts that are willing to follow wherever He leads.

Your usefulness does not rest in your ability. It rests in your willingness to remain close to Him.

What Difference Does This Make?

Everything changes when you realize that every place you go is an opportunity to reflect Jesus Christ.

Your home becomes a place to love as He loved.

Your workplace becomes a place to serve with humility.

Your neighborhood becomes a place to show kindness.

Your conversations become opportunities to speak words that give life.

You stop asking, **"Where is my ministry?"**

Instead, you begin asking, **"Jesus, how do You want to love someone through me today?"**

As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, going in His name becomes the natural overflow of abiding in Him.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

As you begin today, don't ask, **"What great thing can I do for God?"**

Instead ask, **"Jesus, where are You already at work, and how may I walk with You today?"**

Pay attention to the people He places in your path.

Listen carefully. Serve humbly. Speak truth graciously. Love generously.

Remember, you are not carrying Jesus into the world.

He is already at work. He is inviting you to join Him.

Remain close to Jesus. The closer you walk with Him, the more naturally your life will point others toward Him.
