When people begin learning about biblical deliverance, one question often rises to the surface. **"Why does Jesus have authority to set people free?"**

The answer is not found in a method.

It is found in who Jesus is.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus never struggled to prove His authority.

He simply exercised it.

The wind obeyed Him.

The waves obeyed Him.

Disease obeyed Him.

Death itself obeyed Him.

Unclean spirits obeyed Him.

Why? Because Jesus Christ is Lord.

If you want to understand biblical deliverance, you must first understand the authority of the One who delivers.

What Is Jesus Teaching You?

Jesus never acted independently from the Father's will.

Everything He did revealed the Father's heart and accomplished the Father's purpose.

When Jesus spoke, heaven's authority was present because the Son was doing the will of the Father. After His death and resurrection, Jesus declared,

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me."

That is not a partial authority. It is complete authority.

There is no power, no kingdom, no force of darkness, and no circumstance that stands outside His sovereign rule.

This does not mean every question is answered immediately or every struggle ends instantly. It does mean that your hope rests in the One whose authority can never be challenged.



As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, your confidence grows—not because your circumstances have changed, but because your eyes are fixed on the King who reigns over them all.

A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that darkness is stronger than you imagined.
Or maybe you've begun to fear that your situation is beyond hope.
However, scripture never tells you to compare your struggles with the power of darkness.
It tells you to look to Jesus Christ.

Understand, the enemy is real. But he is not equal to Christ.
He is not sovereign.
He is not victorious.

Jesus Christ alone is Lord.
Never allow fear to magnify the enemy beyond what Scripture says.
Instead, let faith magnify the greatness of your Savior—Jesus Christ.

What Difference Does This Make?

When you understand the authority of Jesus, fear begins to lose its grip.
You stop placing your confidence in personalities, techniques, or dramatic experiences.
You begin resting in Christ Himself.

His authority gives you confidence to pray.
His authority gives you courage to obey.
His authority gives you hope when the journey is difficult.
Your faith is no longer built upon what you can do.
It is built upon who Jesus is.

As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, you learn that the safest place for your heart is under the loving authority of your King.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

As you begin today, don't ask, "**How strong is my struggle?**"
Instead ask, "**How great is my Savior?**"

Open His Word.
Remember His promises.
Pray with confidence.
Walk in humility.



Trust His timing.
Obey His voice.

Remain close to Jesus.
The closer you walk with Him, the more you will discover that His authority is never harsh.
It is the loving authority of the Shepherd who gave His life for His sheep.

A Prayer

Father, thank You for sending Your Son, who reigns with all authority in heaven and on earth. Help me keep my eyes fixed upon Jesus instead of my fears. Strengthen my faith through Your Word.

An Invitation

Before you continue reading about biblical deliverance, spend some time with the Lord.
Read the Gospel accounts where Jesus calms the storm, forgives sins, heals the sick, and casts out unclean spirits.

Notice what they all have in common.
They reveal who Jesus is.
Then quietly ask, "**Jesus, where do I need to trust Your authority more completely?**"

Listen with humility.
If fear has been shaping your thinking, surrender it to Him.
If uncertainty has weakened your confidence, bring it honestly before Him.

But because you know the One who holds all authority.

Remain close to Jesus.
