Jesus Is Speaking to You

As you walk with Jesus Christ, He wants you to notice something.

Every person you meet has a story.

Some carry burdens no one else can see.

Some hide behind a smile.

Some are searching for hope but don't know where to find it.

Some have been hurt.

Some have wandered far from God.

Others have never known Me at all.

Don't miss this.

Do not simply look at people. Learn to see them.

Ask Jesus to help you see them as He sees them.

When you begin seeing people through the eyes of Jesus Christ, your heart will begin to love them with His compassion.

What Is Jesus Teaching You?

Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus noticed people others overlooked.

He stopped. He listened. He cared.

He never rushed past a person simply because they seemed unimportant.

His Father loved them. So He loved them.

As you remain close to Jesus, He will begin shaping your heart in the same way.

You will become slower to judge. Quicker to listen.

More ready to encourage.

More willing to pray.



Compassion is not something you manufacture.
It is the fruit of spending time with Jesus.
The closer you remain to Jesus, the more His heart begins to shape yours.

A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that you have little to offer someone who is hurting.
Or maybe you've thought ministry only happens in a church building or during a planned event.
However, Jesus often ministered while simply walking from one place to another.
Many of His greatest conversations happened along the road.

Do not overlook the ordinary moments.
Your Father often does extraordinary work through ordinary acts of love and faithfulness.

What Difference Does This Make?

When you begin seeing people through the eyes of Jesus, interruptions become opportunities. Conversations become invitations.
Listening becomes an expression of love.
You stop asking, **"How quickly can I get to my next task?"**
Instead, your heart begins asking, **"Jesus, what are You doing in this person's life?"**

That question changes the way you live.
As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, compassion becomes the way you see the world because His heart is becoming your heart.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

As you begin today, don't hurry through the people He places in your path.
Slow down. Look into their eyes. Listen carefully. Pray quietly as you speak with them.
Ask, **"Jesus, help me love this person as You love them."**

Understand, you don't need to have every answer.
Sometimes the greatest gift you can give is your presence, your kindness, and your willingness to point someone toward Jesus.

Remain close to Jesus.
The closer you walk with Him, the more clearly you will recognize the people He is inviting you to love.
