Scripture: *“Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, “We have found the Messiah” (that is, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas” (which, when translated, is Peter).”* John 1:40–42

Jesus Is Speaking to You

You have come to know Jesus Christ.
You have experienced His forgiveness.
You have discovered His peace.
You have learned that He is faithful.

Now Jesus invites you to do something wonderfully simple.
Tell someone about Him.
Not because you have learned everything.
Not because you have every answer. But because you know Him.

Understand, you are not introducing people to a religion.
You are introducing them to the Savior who has changed your life.

What Is Jesus Teaching You?

When Andrew met Jesus, he couldn't keep the good news to himself.
He found his brother and simply said, **"We have found the Messiah."**

When the woman at the well encountered Jesus, she hurried back to her town and invited others, **"Come and see."**

Now, don't miss this.
Neither of them knew everything. Neither of them had years of training.
They simply shared what they had discovered. That is still His invitation to you.

Speak honestly about what He has done in your life.
Tell others about His love.
Point them to His Word.
Invite them to come and know Jesus for themselves.



The closer you remain to Jesus, the more naturally your life and your words will reflect the hope you have found in Him.

A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that you must have every answer before you can speak about Jesus. Or maybe you fear saying the wrong thing.

Don't miss this. Remember this. It is not your responsibility to change a heart.

Only Jesus can do that. Your calling is not to convince people.

Your calling is to faithfully bear witness to the hope you have found in Him.

Leave the results to Christ.

What Difference Does This Make?

When you realize that the Father is the One who draws people to His Son, you are set free from the pressure of trying to produce results.

You no longer speak from fear. You speak from gratitude.

You no longer feel that you must have the perfect words.

You simply speak truth with humility and love.

As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, conversations about Him become a natural part of your life—not forced, not rehearsed, but flowing from a heart that knows and loves its Savior.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

As you begin today, ask Jesus to prepare your heart before you ask Him to open a door.

Then pray, **"Jesus, if You give me an opportunity today, help me speak about You with grace, humility, and love."**

Don't force the conversation.

Don't be afraid of silence.

Listen carefully. Love sincerely.

When Jesus opens the door, simply point people to Him.

Remain close to Jesus.

The closer you walk with Him, the more naturally you will speak of the One you love.

A Prayer

Father, thank You for the hope I have found in Your Son.

Help me never be ashamed of Jesus.

Fill my heart with gratitude that overflows into my conversations.



Give me wisdom to know when to speak, compassion to speak with love, and humility to remember that only You can change a heart.

May my life and my words faithfully point others to Jesus Christ.

An Invitation

Before you continue with your day, spend some time with the Lord.

Read today's Scriptures slowly.

Then ask, **"Jesus, who in my life needs to hear about the hope I have found in You?"**

Don't begin by planning a speech.

Begin by praying for that person.

Ask the Lord to prepare both your heart and theirs. Then trust Him.

When He provides the opportunity, simply share the hope you have found.

Remain close to Jesus.

As you continue abiding in Him, you'll discover that the most powerful testimony you can give is not how remarkable you are, but how faithful your Savior has been.

And as Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, your life will become a quiet invitation that says to others, **"Come and see the One who changed my life."**
