Because Jesus never grows weary of welcoming those who come to Him.

A Lie You May Be Believing

Maybe you've believed that because you've stumbled, you've failed as a disciple.

Or maybe you've thought that God has become disappointed with you because your journey has not been perfect.

Understand, Jesus has never called perfect disciples.



He calls people who continue following Him.
When you stumble, He invites you to get up and walk with Him again.
His grace is greater than your weakness.
His mercy is new every morning.
His faithfulness never fails.

The Shepherd does not abandon His sheep because they become tired.
He lovingly strengthens them for the journey ahead.

What Difference Does This Make?

When you understand Christ's faithfulness, your confidence begins to change.
You no longer depend upon your own strength.
You learn to depend upon His.
Instead of asking, **"Can I make it?"**
You begin asking, **"Jesus, help me stay close to You today."**

That simple prayer changes everything.
The Christian life becomes less about striving...and more about abiding.
Less about proving yourself...and more about remaining near the One who is always faithful.

As Jesus Christ becomes your lifestyle, faithfulness becomes less about trying harder and more about continuing to walk with the One who has promised never to leave you nor forsake you.

How Should This Shape the Way You Live?

Don't worry about walking with Jesus for the next twenty years.
Walk with Him today. Spend time in His Word today. Pray today.
Love someone today. Obey what He has shown you today.

Tomorrow will have its own opportunities to trust Him.
But today's invitation is simply this: Stay close to Jesus. He will take care of tomorrow.
