





Chick Cowell was a fixture in the Buena Regional School District at J.P. Cleary Jr. High School and Buena Regional High School for over 35 years. After an excellent athletic and academic undergraduate collegiate career at Bloomfield College and Glassboro State Teachers College (now Rowan University), he did graduate work at Springfield College in Massachusetts prior to a tour of military duty in the US Army. After his military discharge, Chick started teaching health and physical education at Cleary Jr. High and coached football, basketball, baseball and track for 17 years. In 1973 he transferred to the newly opened Buena Regional High school as Athletic Director and Drivers Education Teacher and also coached football and baseball. He retired in 1991 after more than 35 years of service in the Buena Regional School district. Chick now lives in Haines City, Fl, with his wife of 53 years Irene and is father to daughters Donna and Patricia and son Charles Cowell III.


