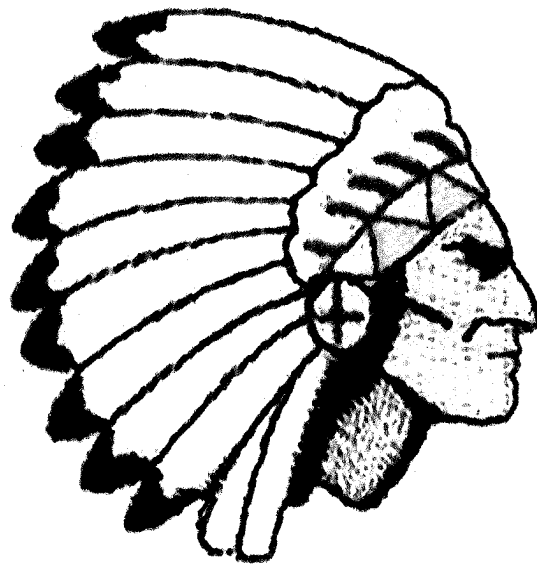

We are deeply honored to accept this wonderful tribute to Richard. We are confident that he is grinning from ear to ear and giving us his "thumbs up."

Richard loved the game of baseball as a youngster and played on a little league team. However, asthma kept him from playing high school baseball. Never to be deterred, he did the next best thing—he became the team's statistician. Keeping the book gave him the opportunity to be a part of the team.

Richard has a natural ability with math and he was gifted with an uncanny ability for recall. A perfect combination! His career as "Stats" continued beyond graduation and into his college years, until he finally surrendered the task to Kim Kurtz Jelinek. He continued to follow "The Chiefs" whenever he could fit it into his work schedule. Two plus years ago, when he became disabled, Richard became a fixture at the games, home and away. He had a special relationship with the team, the coaches, and the fans. Everyone knew of the challenge he was facing and, if he missed a game, someone would call to inquire and let him know how the team had done that day.

Full-time employment was out of the question during this time; not his choice, but he was able to work part-time. Richard loved his work because being productive and useful was very important to him.

Richard had a positive attitude at all times. His diligence and strong faith kept us all inspired. He played an active role in his church. He served on various committees but the most important one was on the finance committee for the Parish Council. He was a Third Degree with the Knights of Columbus. His favorite role was that of lector, delivering the word from the Scriptures.

Richard was passionate about the Buena High School baseball program, he was a fan of the U.S. Space Program, the Oakland Raiders, the Beatles, and the New York Yankees. He would debate you on any issue, as long as he was right. He loved funny TV commercials, his favorite being "The Most Interesting Man in the World."

Richard lived his life to fulfill a three-part mission: the strength to keep fighting, to not be a burden to others, and to help others even if he could not help himself. He was devoted to his family, proud of his Italian-American heritage, dedicated to his faith, and loyal to his friends. A memorial scholarship has been established at Buena High School, which will be offered annually to a graduating senior who shared his love of baseball.

Richard left us on July 2, 2010, but he took with him his '82 Championship jacket, hat and, of course, "the book." He showed by example the value of loving others, working hard to earn what you desire, and living with integrity.

Richard Siciliano was a long-time statistician for the Buena Regional High School baseball team and one of the school's most avid supporters. Although widely recognized as the foremost authority on the history of Buena Regional athletics, Rich's greatest passion remained with the BRHS baseball team. He was relied on for many years by the Buena coaches to accurately detail the activity of every baseball game, a task he both cherished and excelled at. Upon graduation, Richard attended Atlantic Cape Community College and earned a degree in accounting. In 1994 he formed RTS Enterprises, an accounting and payroll company for which he served as President, and recently worked as an accountant for Dakota Prime. On February 22, 2008, Richard was diagnosed with brain cancer, and fought valiantly for the next 2 1/2 years. He tragically succumbed to this illness on July 2, 2010. Rich was an avid New York Yankees and Oakland Raiders fan, and he loved the U.S. Space Program and the Beatles. More than anything, he loved the Buena Regional High School sports programs. He leaves behind a loving family and many friends whose lives he touched in many wonderful ways. Richard is the first supporter to be inducted into the Buena Regional Hall of Fame.

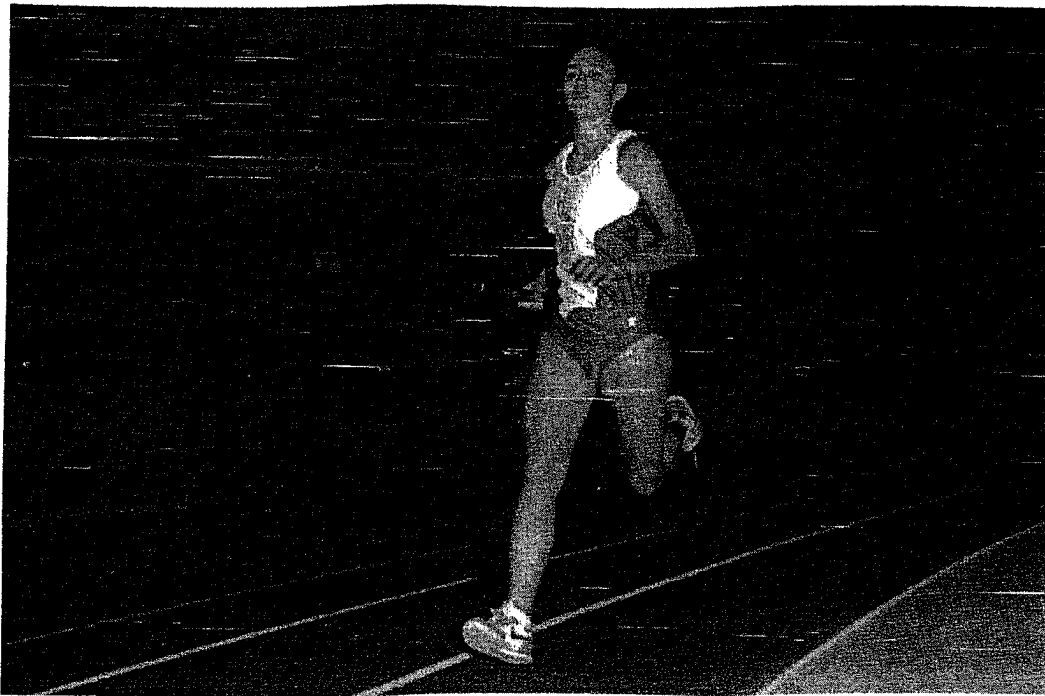

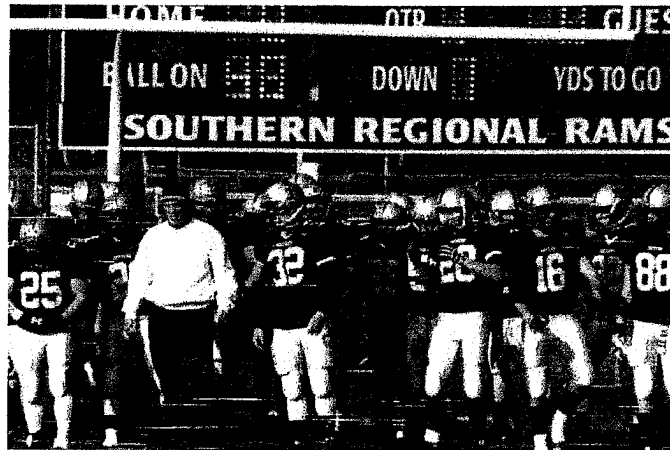
### **Football, Tennis**

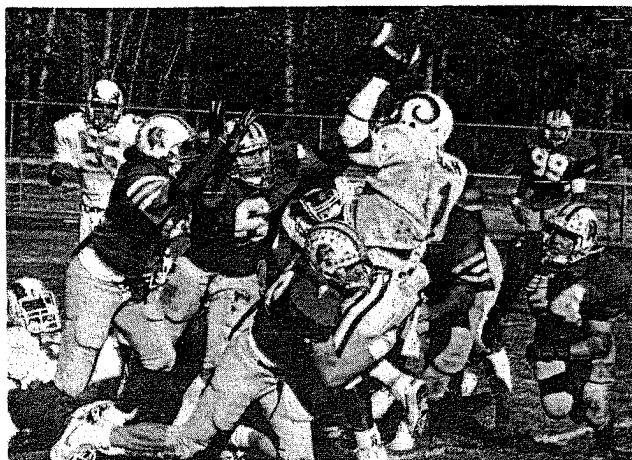

The 1988 football team can be described as an offensive scoring machine and a hard hitting defensive team. The Chiefs never scored less than 20 points in a game, held opponents to one score or less in eight games and did not give up any first half points to any team during the year. The team outscored its entire schedule 417-75 and had three shutouts. Additionally, the Chiefs outscored its two playoff opponents, 69-0, to win the South Jersey Group II championship. Linebacker George Maxwell and defensive end Shawn Smith were among the very best in the state at their positions. Bill Barrale was the quarterback, running for 11 TDs, and junior running back Damon Nelson scored 114 points. Obie Dadds, another junior running back, added 11 more TDs. Tom Maxwell and Ed Torres were the receivers and Gary Pustizzi was a big force on the offensive line. The BRHS football team accomplished the first perfect season by a Cape Atlantic League team. Coach Donohue was named the South Jersey coach of the year by the Brooks-Irvine Club.

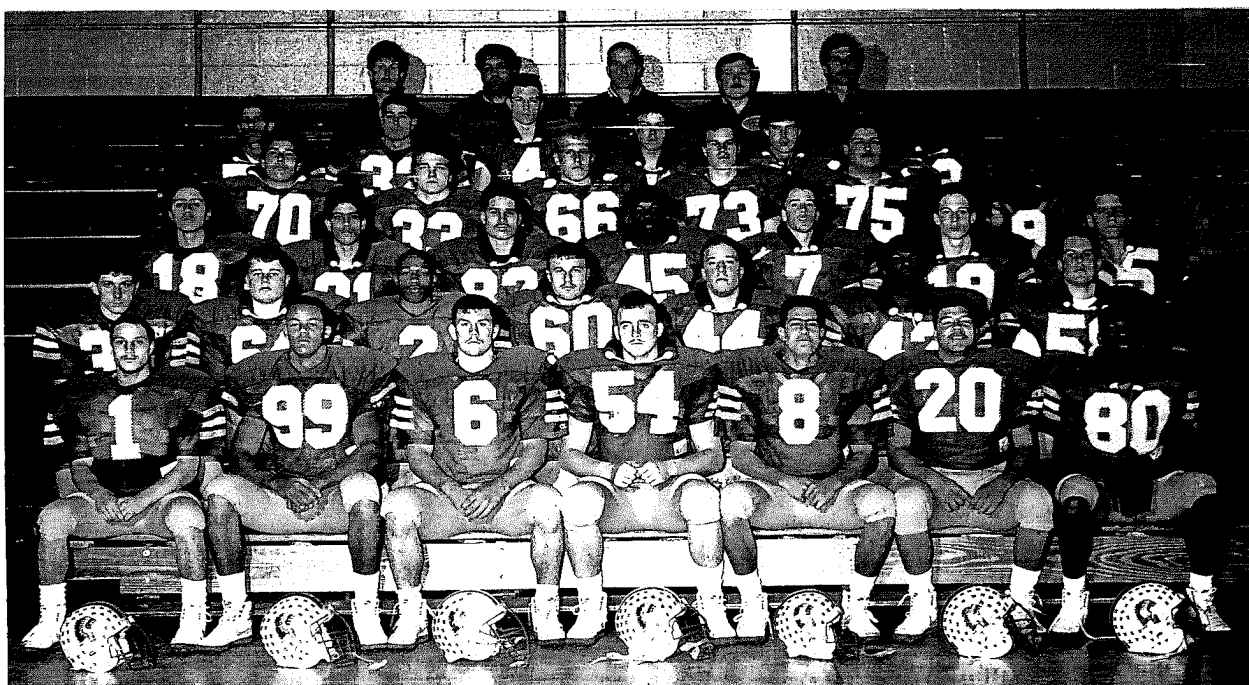
