Williams Leads Buena Into Playoffs

After having an 11-12 season last winter and failing to qualify for the sectional playoffs, the Buena High girls' basketball team is experiencing a resurgence. Look no further than Cammie Williams for the reason why. Williams, a 5-foot, 8-inch center for the Chiefs, is the second-leading scorer in South Jersey, with 22.6 points per game. What's more, she is collecting 16.6 rebounds a game. Playoff-bound Buena enters this week's game with a 15-5 overall record and an 11-4 mark in the Cape Atlantic II League. "The team goes when Cammie goes," said Buena coach Gerry Grunwell. "We go to her quite a bit. She has talent she hasn't used yet. Hopefully, we'll get that out of her before she leaves here." Williams, a junior, who already has 837 points and 794 rebounds in her career - she been starting since her freshman year - plays with an aggressiveness that belies her size. She is joined in the Chiefs starting lineup by 5-3 guards Tina Weightman (12.0), Sharon Greene and Julie Hopp, and 5-6 forward Melissa Comparri. Off the bench, the squad relies on 5-5 Sharon Sutton and 5-2 Rhonda Ciralo. "I'm the tallest player on the team, and my height is not a problem for me," Williams said about playing center. "I'm 5-8, but I play 6-0. I don't take another player's height as competition. I go by what they can do." Because of her scoring ability, Williams finds that opposing teams take extra measures to contain her. The prevailing thinking is that if you stop Williams, you beat Buena. "It's a lot of pressure, and it's hard sometimes, but I just keep playing and hustling," Williams said. "We all go out to play to the best of our ability." With only one senior starter, the best is yet to come for Buena, which will be in the Group 2 field when the sectionals, start Feb. 29. "Next year I think we'll be at the top," said Williams, whose team is in third place in the Cape II League. "We've played better than I expected and improved steadily from the beginning," Grunwell said. "I'm looking forward next to next year."

Grunwell: Winner With Courage

If you asked a Buena High girls' basketball player what was the biggest factor in the Chiefs' Cape Atlantic II League championship season, the answer probably would be that the squad was like a family. If you asked who created that family atmosphere, the player would tell you that it was coach Gerry Grunwell. "He cared so much about us," said junior guard Tina Weightman. "He knew we had talent, and he built us up. He was calm, always positive, and he seemed to know that we'd prevail. We're like a family, and coach Grunwell made us that way." For a while, the Chiefs weren't sure they would have Grunwell on the bench this season. The third-year coach was diagnosed as having Hodgkins disease in late August, and he wasn't at full strength when preseason practice began. But he didn't miss a game. Grunwell was a source of strength for the Chiefs, and this translated into victories on the court. Buena won its last 15 regular-season outings to win the school's first league title in either boys' or girls' basketball, finished with a 23-4 record and tied for No. 10 in The Inquirer's South Jersey Top 10. Those accomplishments make Grunwell The Inquirer's South Jersey girls' basketball coach of the year. "We weren't sure when Coach was coming back, and we would have done our best even if he didn't," said Cammie Williams, Buena's all-South Jersey center. "But, in my heart, I don't think we'd have done as well as we did if he didn't get back." He told us at the beginning of the season that he wasn't going to run out on us. His sickness and recovery and coming back strong made the team work hard. He gave us that inspiration to keep going." Grunwell, 42, has recovered from his bout with cancer. He had a malignant growth removed from his chin in September, and he also had an operation to remove his spleen. Radiation treatments followed, and Grunwell didn't return to school until Thanksgiving week. "Practice would be starting after Thanksgiving, and I wanted to see if I could get through a school day, let alone a practice," he said. "And I thought I felt pretty good until I spent a day around here. Up through Christmas, we'd line up what we wanted to do in practice, and I'd let (assistant coach) Theresa Triola run it. I practically lay on the bleachers and watched." Grunwell said the approaching basketball season gave him the inspiration he needed to get ready for it. "I didn't have time to feel sorry for myself. I was thinking about getting back," he said. "I had it in my mind that I was going to do it, no matter what." When he did, Buena won nine of its first 12 games. Then it didn't lose again until Delran knocked it out of the South Jersey Group 2 tournament. The Chiefs clinched the Cape II title on Feb. 21 with a victory over Middle Township. "The most satisfying moment for me was sitting on the bench and looking at the faces of the girls as they came off the court after we clinched," Grunwell said. "I had such a feeling of pride that this team could rise to that level." The Buena players are proud to have Grunwell as their coach. "When he got back, it meant to us that this was our year to do it (win the title)," Weightman said. "He wouldn't let us slack off. He was persistent, and that's what we needed. He was always there." "We grew together this year - with each other and with coach Grunwell," Williams said. "He didn't care what we did wrong, or what went wrong. He stayed behind us. He respected us as players and believed in each and every one of us for what we could do."
